Summary:

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) has received an application, seeking approval to subdivide the subject land into eight (8) residential lots. Prior to determining the application, the Commission has requested the Town of Narrogin's comment on the proposal.

Background:

Lot 255 is a vacant allotment located between Doney and Grant Streets in east Narrogin. Positioned half way between Moore Street and Burns Street, the property has an area of approximately 8,750m². The property is relatively level and clear of significant vegetation.

As detailed in the application for subdivision, it is proposed to subdivide the land into 8 residential allotments, with four lots to face each Grant and Doney Street. If approved, each property will have an area in excess of 1,000m² with a road frontages varying from 16.4m to 17.79m in width.

A copy of the application for subdivision, including the submitted plan is attached.

Comment:

The provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 2 include the subject land within the "Single Residential" Zone. As detailed in the Zoning Development Table, single dwellings may be established in the "Single Residential" Zone at a density not exceeding R12.5.

In accordance with the Residential Design Codes of Western Australia, lots created at a density of R12.5 are to have a minimum lot size of 700m², with an average of 800m². A minimum road frontage of 17m is also stipulated.

Whilst the creation of 8 lots as proposed would comply with the minimum lot size, 7 of the proposed 8 lots would not meet the minimum lot frontage requirement. Further comment on this aspect of the proposed is provided in the Statutory Environment and Strategic Implications Sections overleaf.

Consultation: Chief Executive Officer – Aaron Cook

Statutory Environment:

In accordance with the Planning and Development Act 2005 (and associated regulations), applications for approval to the subdivision of land are lodged with an determined by the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC). In determining these applications, the Commission will have regard to adopted State Policy and comments from relevant government and service authorities.

In order to guide the assessment of applications for subdivision, the WAPC has prepared and adopted the following relevant policies:

- a) State Planning Policy No 3 – Urban Growth and Settlement
- b) State Planning Policy No 3.1 – Residential Design Codes of Western Australia.
- c) Development Control Policy No 1.1 – Subdivision of Land General Principals
- d) Development Control Policy No 2 .2 – Residential Subdivision

As detailed in clause 3.2.1 of Development Control Policy No 2.2, “Generally the minimum lot size and frontage requirements of the R-Codes will form the basis for the subdivision of residential land”. As reflected by the use of the word “generally”, the WAPC has the authority to vary these requirements where the application is otherwise consistent with WAPC policy and requirements.

As detailed in the comment section, the proposed lots exceed the required minimum lot size, but do not meet the recommended minimum lot frontage.

The application appears to be consistent with all other requirements including the availability of services and proximity to public open space.

Policy Implications: Nil

Financial Implications:

The subdivision of the land into 8 residential lots as proposed will result in the creation of 7 additional rateable properties.

Strategic Implications:

The subject land is the single largest residential allotment in this area of East Narrogin. Lots immediately adjacent to the site range from 730m², to just over 900m² in area.

If the minimum lot frontage of 18 metres was enforced, then a maximum of 6 residential lots could be created. This would result in each proposed lot having an area in excess of 1,458m² in area. Given that the site is located in an area which predominantly contains lots less than 1,000m² in area and the fact all necessary urban services are available to the land, such a subdivision would in the authors opinion represent an underutilisation of land.

Having regard to the prevailing lot size and existing form of urban development, it is recommended that Council support the application as submitted.

 - ii. No lot being less than 1,000m² in area. (LG)
 - iii. Suitable arrangements being made with the Water Corporation so that provision of a suitable water supply service will be available to lot(s) shown on the approved plan of subdivision.
 - iv. Suitable arrangements being made with the Water Corporation so that provision of a sewerage service will be available to the lot/s shown on the approved plan of subdivision. (Water Corporation)
 - v. Arrangements being made to the satisfaction of the Western Australian Planning Commission and to the specification of Western Power for the provision of an underground electricity supply service to the lot(s) shown on the approved plan of subdivision.
 - vi. Such padmount sites as may be required by Western Power being transferred free of cost to Western Power, with the locations of the site being to the satisfaction of the Western Australian Planning Commission (Western Power)(LG).
- b) should the applicant be required to provide 10% public open space, the Town of Narrogin would prefer the payment of cash-in-lieu given that adequate open space exists in the immediately locality.



- 2 The WAPC is responsible for determining applications for freehold and survey strata subdivision under the *Planning and Development Act 2005* and *Strata Titles Act 1985*. The information required for an application is authorised by regulation 25 of the *Planning and Development Regulations 2009*. There are penalties for providing false information.
- 3 Applications for a freehold and survey strata subdivision require a fully completed form 1A with any additional information attached, the correct application fee and multiple copies of a subdivision plan and any supporting documentation (see part 7 of form 1A).
- 4 Subdivision plans must be based on an accurate and up-to-date feature survey (survey of existing physical features and improvements such as driveways, buildings as required by part 7). The additional information requirements, under part 7 item 17, are not required for amalgamation approval.
- 5 The applicant must sign part 1. All landowners or an agent with written authority must sign part 3. Agents must provide written authority from the landowner.
- 6 The application fee must accord with the current schedule of fees.
- 7 Applicants must check that there are no restrictive covenants applying to the land or if there are, attend to the resulting liabilities and obligations. The WAPC is only bound by the terms of restrictive covenants created under statute in favour of a public authority.
- 8 Applicants must state the application type, freehold or survey strata subdivision, on part 5 of form 1A. A separate application is required for each application type, freehold or survey strata subdivision. Application fees for cancelled applications will not be refunded if the application has been referred to external agencies.

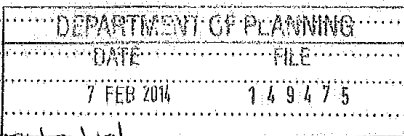

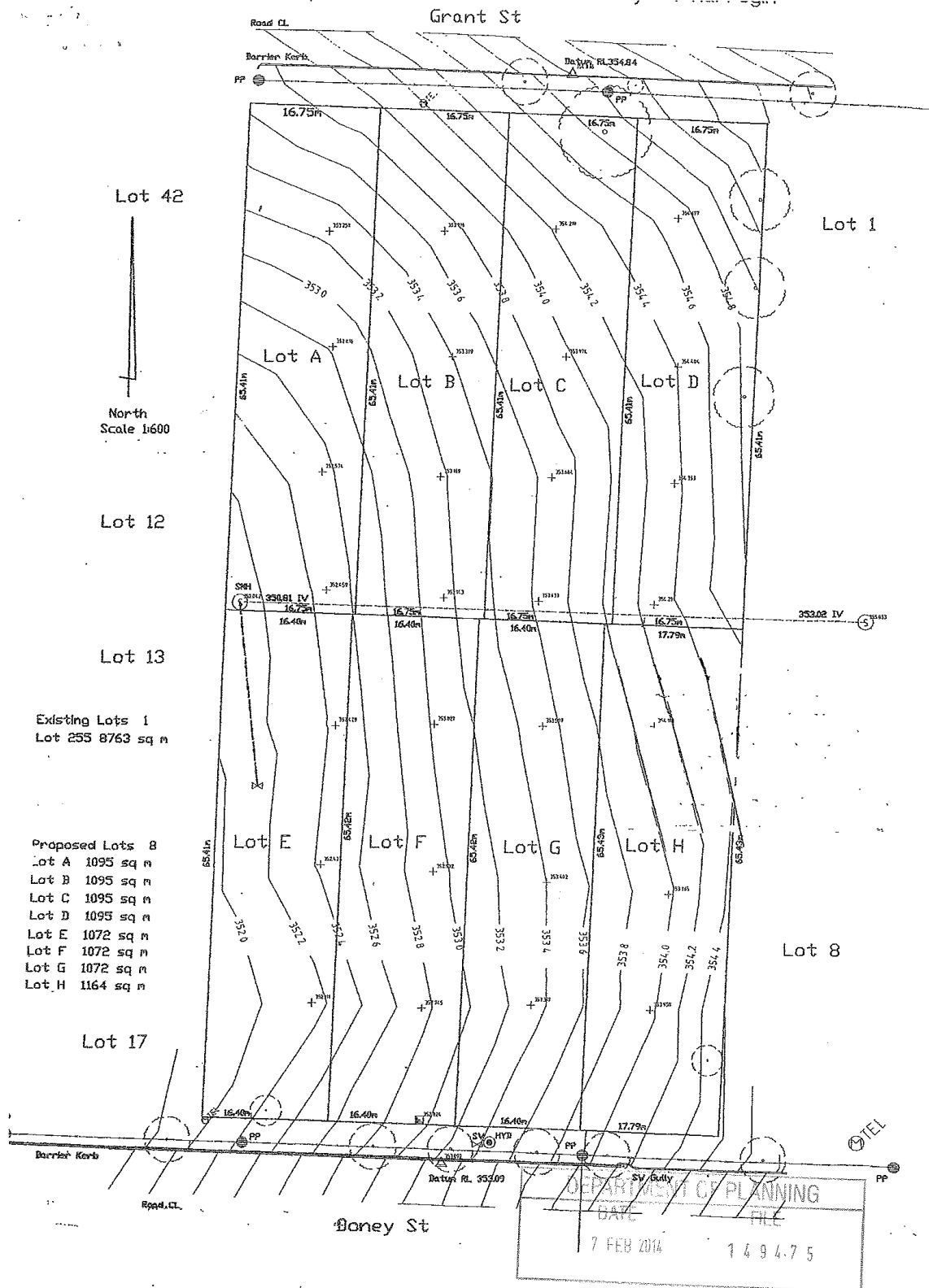

Summary:

Correspondence has been received from Main Roads WA requesting the Town of Narrogin's comment on a proposal to increase the size of restricted access vehicles permitted to use Kipling Street from RAV 4 to RAV 6.

Background:

Currently the Restricted Vehicle Access Network permits vehicles up to 36.5m long (RAV 7) to travel along Williams Road/Lefroy Street and Clayton Road from Lefroy to the roundabout at Pioneer Drive. East of Pioneer Drive, access is only permitted for vehicles up to 27.5m in length (Rav 4).

Main Roads WA has received a request from Peter Hill & Sons, being farmers at Modesty Rock, seeking to have vehicles up to 36.5 metres in length (RAV 5) permitted on the Williams-Kondinin Road and Kipling Street. Prior to determining the request, Main Roads has requested the Town of Narrogins comment on the proposal.

A copy of the Main Roads correspondence is shown attached.

Comment:

The current Restricted Access Vehicle network is somewhat disjointed with Network 7 (up to 36.5m) vehicles permitted to proceed west along Clayton Road, but only as far as the roundabout. In order to proceed further eastward along Kipling Street, the truck operator must first 'breakdown' the load to comply with a maximum length of 27.5 metres.

Similarly vehicles larger than permitted on a Rav 4 network as supposed to breakdown their load prior to entering the town from the east.

This results in an occasional trailer being temporally being parked in the Leisure Centre Carpark and/or the recessed parking bays on Clayton Road abutting the Tennis Club. Trailers are being left in these locations until the driver is able to reach a suitable breakdown area and return to collect the parked trailer.

Council staff have also observed Network 7 vehicles using the RAV 4 network without first "Breaking Down" their load.

Given that Clayton Road to Kipling Street is essentially a straight run for freight vehicles, it is recommended that the current network classifications should be reviewed. That said, there are several potential issues with permitting larger vehicles on Kipling Street, which are summarised as follows:

a) Existing Pavement

The existing pavement on Kipling Street is not considered to be in good condition. Main Roads has recognised this and will shortly commence work on that section of Kipling Street between the roundabout and Garfield Street. Works east of Garfield Street will be staged over future years.

Permitting larger vehicles on Kipling Street is likely to result in the road pavement deteriorating at a faster rate, impacting on other road users.

b) Noise

Larger heavy loads often result in noise levels that detrimentally impact on adjacent residential properties. This noise is generally created through acceleration, braking and/or gearing down. Empty loads can also create excessive noise where the road pavement is not smooth and rumbling or rattling noise results.

To minimise the potential for noise, it is recommended that the current surface of Kipling Street should be upgraded and the speed of vehicles should be restricted to a maximum of 40km/hr. It is also recommended that Main Roads consider limiting the hours that such truck movements are permitted.

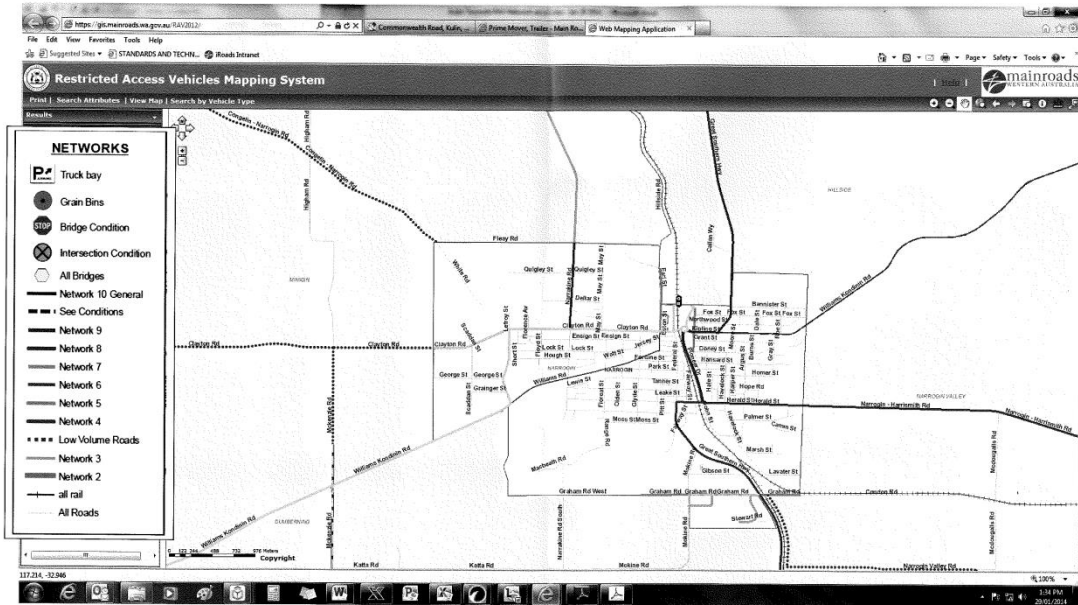

It is presented to Council to endorse the Wheatbelt Aged Support and Care Solutions Report.

Background:

During 2013 the Town of Narrogin joined with other local governments in the southern Wheatbelt area to develop a plan that will provide evidence based solutions to improve aged care across the region.

The Wheatbelt Development Commission has overseen the preparation of this plan. It has been developed by Verso Consulting Pty Ltd with input from individuals, communities, local governments, State Government agencies and not-for-profit organisations

The Wheatbelt Development Commission would like local governments to endorse and sign off on the Plan.

Comment:

The initial request for local government to be involved in the project came in 2012. At that time the Wheatbelt Integrated Aged Support and Care Solution/s (WIASCS) project was described as focusing on all facets of aged care from Well-Aged Friendly Communities, Aged Appropriate Housing and Community Care to Residential Care including Dementia and Respite care. These solutions will centre on supporting people to age in their communities longer and receive the services they need and deserve.

The project aimed to develop and assist in the implementation of the Wheatbelt Integrated Aged Care and Support Solution(s), through these guiding principles:

Principle 1: The importance of place

Principle 2: Community life

Principle 3: Community's sense of ownership

Principle 4: Focus on the person

- Principle 5: Choice
- Principle 6: Equitable access
- Principle 7: Practicality
- Principle 8: Viability

A copy of the overview for local government is included as an attachment to this agenda. The full report is tabled for information and Council is asked to endorse it.

The Wheatbelt Development Commission are currently progressing a funding application in relation to recommendations from the report. It hopes to attract Royalties for Regions funds of \$2,530,00 for a project titled *Creating Age-Friendly Communities in Small Towns Project*.

If successful in obtaining the funding the *Creating Age-Friendly Communities in Small Towns Project* will assist local governments in the Wheatbelt to improve age friendly infrastructure by providing:

- An audit report of the individual communities which will identify specific age-friendly infrastructure and service gaps and priorities and allow Local Governments to monitor key deliverables of the project;
- A plan to assist local governments to achieve an age-friendly community;
- Funding in the form of a small grants scheme to act as a catalyst for the implementation of infrastructure projects identified in the age-friendly community planning and
- An integrated transport plan that will identify innovative ways to provide improved transport options for the community.
