~ Council Decisions ~

The Council decisions made at the meeting held on 24 May include:

Telstra Wall Mural Proposal

Council resolved to not approve an artwork for installation on the Telstra building in Fortune Street at this stage. The Council believed that the proposal put forward by the Council's Townscape Advisory Committee, whilst meritorious, was not commensurate with the prominence of the site and location and the Council decided to roll the money over to the next Budget Year in order to consider more significant murals at this site and also the Good Shed Site, once that latter site was reclad.

Corporate Business Plan—2023 Review

Council adopted the Corporate Business Plan 2023-2027. A copy of this can be found on the Shire's website https:// www.narrogin.wa.gov.au/documents/1459/ corporate-business-plan-2023-2027

Shire of Narrogin Differential Rating

Council adopted (for the purposes of advertising) the rates in the dollar and minimum rates for the Gross Rental Value differential rate categories for the 2023/24 financial year for the urban properties of the Shire (those in the Townsites of Narrogin and Highbury and rural residential / urban used properties adjacent or near the town sites). The Urban Gross Rental Value has been set at 12.7712c and a minimum rate of \$1,249 and Rural Gross Rental Value at 9.6959c with a minimum rate of \$1,053 and lesser minimum of \$865. The proposal is our for public comment until .Friday 23 June at 4pm.. Council Policy 3.6 Rating – Merger Parity Transition

Council adopted an amended Policy 3.6 Rating – Merger Parity Transition. This policy now reflects the pause in the transition agreement due to COVID, where no rates increased were applied across the whole Shire, by adding another year to the transition.

Amendment To Policy 3.13 To Incorporate 'Spot Rating'

Council adopted amendments to Policy 3.13 Rating – Change in Predominant Use of Rural Land. This policy has been amended to include "spot rating". Spot Rating is where a portion of a rural property is used for non-rural purposes and thus should be rated on Gross Rental Valuation (GRV) principles, resulting in higher rates being paid, which in turn spreads the burden more fairly on those more or less able to pay rates. The half a dozen businesses who will be affected by this policy change will be contacted and invited to make submissions to the Council.

YMCA Annual Budget For NRLC – 2023/24

Council declined the proposed budget submitted by the YMCA WA for the management of the Narrogin Regional Leisure Centre for the next financial year. The Shire President and Chief Executive Officer are seeking an urgent meeting with the Y's Chief Executive Officer and Chairperson to discuss this and other issues.

The full minutes can be found on the Shire's website. Council Meetings commence at 7pm and are held on the fourth Wednesday of each month. Community members are most welcome to attend.

Lions Park

The Lions Club brought to the Shires attention concerns regarding some trees in the park. Upon close inspection of the trees, it was found that they were diseased, infested with white ants, structurally unsound and damaging other assets nearby in the park and

consequently removed for public safety.

New more suitable broad canopy trees will be planted in their place soon for the provision of shade in time. It is also planned, pending the 2023/24 Budget, further upgrades for the park including the installation of inclusive swings, replacement footpath, additional seating, bin surrounds, and additional irrigation and turfed areas. It is envisaged that these proposed works, if approved, will be completed by December 2023.

Park Street Widening

A section of Park Street from the junction of Federal Street to near the CWA building is currently being widened. This will allow parking either side of the road and safe passing of traffic in this section.

Over the course of the event, both locals and visitors, had the opportunity to embark on geocaching adventures in nearby areas such as Dryandra and Yilliminning Rock.

These picturesque locations provided the perfect backdrop for the treasure hunt, encouraging exploration while immersing participants in the natural beauty of our town and surrounding areas.
