#### 5. ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE PERSON PRESIDING WITHOUT DISCUSSION

#### 5.1 TEN YEAR FOOTPATH PROGRAM

The Presiding Member noted with dismay Council's decision at the Ordinary Council Meeting (24 April 2019) at Item 10.2.2 in which the Townscape Committee requested that Council support its recommendation to ensure that all future footpaths constructed be finished with colours that match the existing coloured asphalt.

Council's decision was as follows:

Council adopted the Proposed Ten Year Footpath Construction Program 2019-2029 as presented and did not accept the request of the Townscape Committee's to ensure that all future concrete footpaths be finished to match the existing red coloured asphalt footpaths, as it will: 1. Add additional cost; 2. Not guarantee a continuously same coloured footpath network; and 3. Run the risk of the network being seen as further disjointed.

#### 7. MATTERS WHICH REQUIRE DECISIONS

#### 7.1 DRAFT SHIRE OF NARROGIN TOWN CENTRE COLOUR GUIDE

In late 2018, H&H Architects were appointed to develop a colour palette and style guide for the Shire of Narrogin. The aim of this project is to enhance Narrogin's CBD by achieving a cohesive colour palette and streetscape.

H&H Architects in undertaking this work, reviewed the study area and existing Shire planning policies, investigated precedents from other local governments and conducted site inspections. H&H also discussed at an informal meeting with Narrogin District Townscape Committee members the main elements, objectives and benefits of cohesive colour and material palettes and design guidelines, in the CBD.

The Draft Shire of Narrogin Town Centre Colour Guide was presented to the Townscape Committee at the meeting held on 28 March 2019, and to the Elected Members and Executive Management Team (EMT) at the Monthly Briefing Session (MBS) on 10 April 2019.

In that MBS, Elected Members and the EMT provided feedback to the consultant regarding the colour palette, and advised that the preferred approach to manage the Draft Development Guidelines for Narrogin Town Centre Precinct currently incorporated into the 2015 Municipal Heritage Inventory (MHI), was to incorporate them into the forthcoming Colour Guide and Visual Signage Guide where required /appropriate.

H&H is preparing a Visual Signage Guide as an outcome of the MBS presentation, using the text within the Draft Shire of Narrogin Town Centre Colour Guide. This will mean the Signage Guide will be populated with images. The intention is for the Signage Guide to apply to all buildings in the CBD, not just heritage buildings, with Shire planning officers able to use their discretion on a case-by-case basis in terms of approving signage.

The CBD was defined in the 2016 Townscape Study Review as the zone bounded by Park Street through to Ensign Street, between Earl Street through to Fairway Street. This includes Egerton Street, Fortune Street, Federal Street and Smith Street. However what is termed the Central Zone is only bounded by Egerton Street, Fortune Street, Fairway Street and Earl Street. H&H Architects focused on the Central Zone for their study as it is the centre of town and H&H views this Zone as a good starting point for this work. It is noted that a review underway of the Municipal Heritage Inventory (MHI) involves the creation of street precincts and these are not considered useful for defining the Zone. It should also be noted that there are some significant heritage listed buildings which fall within the CBD area and that any future development of these buildings, incorporating the proposed colour palette and style guide, will require approval from the Department of Planning, Land and Heritage.

H&H have argued the Colour Guide should apply to all buildings in the Central Zone, not just heritage buildings. Owners of buildings which are on the State Register should be encouraged to explore original colour schemes through paint scrapes, as per the Colour Guide and best practice for heritage places.

#### 8. STATUS REPORT UPDATE

#### 8.1 SKATEPARK LANDSCAPE DESIGN

The Committee are asked to consider the proposed landscape design for the Narrogin Skatepark and provide comments and / or suggestions in writing to the MCLC, which will be forwarded to the consultant. Copies of the proposed landscape design will be circulated at the Narrogin District Townscape Committee meeting to be held on Thursday 2 May 2019.

In January 2017 the Shire appointed specialist skatepark construction contractor Convic, to undertake the Skatepark expansion project which was partially funded with a Lotterywest grant. The project concept design included landscaping, however at that time the cost to landscape was in excess of the total project funds.

An amount of \$69,810 was allocated in the 2018/2019 Budget to complete the landscaping in the 2018/2019 financial year. The budget is intended to cover the cost of landscaping, shade structures, bins and furniture and the Urban Art Project (completed).

The MCLC circulated copies of the proposed draft concept design and it was noted that while the proposed design was not one of the Key Projects recommended in the Gnarojin Park Masterplan (page 34), the proposed design, plants and park furniture are in line with recommendations made in the Gnarojin Park Masterplan Overall Plan (Page 34).

The Committee noted the plans for construction.

#### 8.2 MEMORIAL PARK ACCESSIBLE ABLUTION BLOCK

The Shire presented to the Heritage Council WA, plans for a proposed accessible ablution block for construction in Memorial Park. The proposed design was not approved by the Heritage Council and following the recommendations made by the Heritage Council, the Shire presented an alternate design which was approved in March 2019.

At the March Monthly Briefing Session, the amended and Heritage Council approved design was presented for the Elected Members to consider. They made some minor recommendations for changes and it was their view that the proposal should progress to RFQ.

The Committee are asked to note that this project has been budgeted for in the 2018/2019 Budget and completion is anticipated by 30 June 2019.

The Committee requested information relating to the colour of the roof, and the walls/rendering and the style of seating that will be installed.

The EMDRS will follow up this request with the project's managers and advise the Committee of the Heritage Council approved colours.

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


**DETAIL ELEVATION A**


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


### PLAN DETAIL 5 STEEL POST FOOTING
