~ COUNCIL DECISIONS ~

The Shire President opened the Ordinary Council Meeting of 24 March announcing the unprecedented affect the COVID crisis will have on the community. The scheduled presentation from ARtS Narrogin was unfortunately postponed. The Council decisions made at the meeting include:

Proposed Café - Council agreed to invite comments from the community and surrounding businesses about a proposed café in the Church Square old church building proposing an ancillary play area.

Narrogin Refuse Site - A Facility Management Plan was adopted for the White Road Refuse Site as a guideline and planning tool for its current and future direction.

Carpark Tree Planting - Council agreed to consider planting trees in the Narrogin Regional Recreation Centre carpark during its 2020/21 Budget deliberations.

Smith Street Ablutions - Council agreed with the Townscape Committee's recommendation to contact Coles to measure their interest in purchasing the Shire-owned toilet facility in the Coles carpark for the purpose of maintaining or converting to parking or indeed to consider other options.

Townscape Terms of Reference -Council agreed to adjust the Townscape Advisory Committee's number of meetings from four to six.

A Fraud & Corruption Prevention Policy and Plan were adopted by the Council.

Jessie House - Council approved the use of Reserve Funds to upgrade Jessie House so as to enable it to provide respite care from within the facility at an estimated cost of \$140,000.

Community Chest - Applications from Community Groups seeking funding for projects benefitting the wider community were approved as recommended by the Community Chest Reference Group (see the full minutes for detail of recipients on the Shire's website).

Professional Development - Council adopted a policy relating to the continuing professional development of elected members.

The full minutes can be found on the Shire's website. During the pandemic, Council Meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of each month via Skype for Business. At the Shire, we continue to adhere to Government agency advice to keep our customers, employees and community as safe as possible.
