Jenny Menasse WACHS-Wheatbelt

- Covid is circulating in the community, it is now being treated as any other infectious disease.
- Regional Emergency Operating Cell (REOC) has been organised so that there will be sufficient staff available in emergency.

Anna Erickson Department of Primary Industry & Regional Development

- Still involved with recovery works from cyclone Seroja.

Michele Duxbury Department of Communities

- Participated in a training with Narrogin Regional leisure Centre (NRLC) which was very successful.
- Please ensure that all details are up to date.
- Department of Communities has just been requested to open an Evacuation centre opened at Cervantes due to the fires in the area.

Simon Vogel DFES

- Staff are on standby, everyone is fully trained .
- There are two water bombers based in Narrogin for the next few weeks this may be extended if required. They are on call for other areas.

Mitchel Davies DBCA – Parks & Wildlife Services

- They have a few vacancies and are currently working through the recruitment process.

Peter Erickson State Emergency Service

- All volunteers are up to date with waterbomber training – ready for season.

Pip Porter Narrogin Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades

- Volunteers have been participating in DFES Fire awareness training.
- Brigades have been building up equipment and checking for PPE.
- Plans for the next lot of mitigation work.
- A few years ago there was an emergency exercise with Bush Fire Volunteers, DFES, police, hospital etc another exercise would be beneficial for all involved.
- Local brigades are meeting and organising themselves.

Graham Broad Deputy President Shire of Narrogin

- Asked if the Shire is aware of progress of Litigation by land owners against Western Power?

Leigh Ballard President Shire of Narrogin

- District Emergency Management is continuing to look at mental health and are currently contacting all farmers affected by the East Narrogin fire.

Azhar Awang Executive Manager Development & Regulatory Services

- Judith from Blazeaid is providing details on the number of volunteers who may be returning to the area in the new year. It is anticipated that they will return in March, they have indicated that they would like to stay in Narrogin this time so the use of Clayton Oval is being investigated. They would be doing fencing in March/April and tree planting in June/July.
