#### Summary

Council's consideration is requested in regards to the proposed subdivision of Part Lot 26 Fleay Road, Narrogin for the creation of six (6) lots.

#### Background

The matter was previously considered by Council at its meeting held on 2 October 2009. Council at that meeting resolved as follows:

#### That Council:

- 1. Revoke resolution 10.1.586 from the Ordinary Council meeting of August 2009;
- 2. Advise the Western Australian Planning Commission that it supports application 140657 for the proposed subdivision of Lot 26 Fleay Road, Narrogin into 16 Lots as per plan 4 dated 17 September 2009, subject to the following conditions
  - a) A geotechnical study regarding the land's capability to sustain building development including onsite effluent disposal being submitted to the satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin;
  - b) A noise study with regards to the potential impact of the bus depot and mechanical servicing operations at Lots 5,6,7 & 8 Quigley Street, Narrogin being submitted to the satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin;
  - c) Street corners within the subdivision being truncated to a standard truncation of 8.5 metres;
  - The land being graded and stabilised at the subdividers cost to the satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin;

- e) The land being filled and/or drained at the subdividers cost to the satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin, and any easements and/or reserves necessary for the implementation thereof, being provided free of cost;
- f) Arrangements being made with the Town for the upgrading of Quigley Street, Fleay Road, May Street and Narrakine Road prior to the commencement of earthworks;
- g) A stormwater management and disposal plan being developed and submitted to the Town;
- h) A dual use path being constructed on May and Quigley Street with the precise alignment and extent of construction being to the satisfaction and specifications of the Town; and
- i) A landscaping and street tree plan being developed and submitted to the Town.

On 11 January 2010, the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) granted conditional approval for the proposed subdivision subject to conditions (see attachment 2) which is for the development of a total of sixteen (16) lots.

The applicant was aggrieved by Condition 1 and 10 of the WAPC conditions of approval and referred the matter to the State Administrative Tribunal (SAT) for review. Condition 1 of the approval pertains to the requirements for a section 70A Notification on the Certificate of Title of the impacts from nearby bus depot and mechanical services and Condition 10 was in regards to provision of sewerage service by the Water Corporation.

On 9 November 2010, SAT determined the outcome and allowed the application to be reviewed and the conditions of approval varied which was conveyed by way of an amended conditions to the subdivision (see attachment 5).

Since that time the Planning Approval has expired (11 January 2014) and a fresh planning application is required for consideration.

On 15 August 2016, Council received a referral application for a subdivision from the Western Australian Planning Commission in regards to a proposed subdivision (Application No: 154075) at Lot 26 Fleay Road, Narrogin.

The proposal is to create a total of six (6) Lots with all lots fronting onto Narrakine Road and the remainder of Lot 26 to remain as a large block (7.6244 hectares). The lots are mainly 2,002m² with proposed Lot 6 having an area of 2,046m².

#### Comment

#### Zoning

Lot 26 Fleay Road is zoned "Single Residential" under the Shire's Local Planning Scheme No 2. The Scheme provision requires a minimum of 850m² for unsewered lot. The Proposed Planning Scheme No 3 is to rezone the area with a Residential Coding of 'R5'. This will allow a minimum lot size of 2,000m² consistent with the proposed subdivision.

The Subject lot has a total area of 8.2035hectares.

#### Structure Plan

The current Town Planning Scheme No 2 shows the overall development pattern for the subject property, however, due to there being no reticulated sewer provided to the area, it is not possible to develop the lots as shown in the Planning Scheme Map. That being said it is recommended that a structure plan be provided to demonstrate how the overall site is to be developed. The applicant in their earlier submission in September 2009 submitted an overall subdivision plan (see attachment 4) of the site which the previous subdivision approval was granted. Based on the overall structure plan, the proposed subdivision would be a minor departure from the overall subdivision plan in terms of lot layout. It is recommended that the applicant submit an overall subdivision plan prior to considering any further subdivision of the site. As the proposed subdivision will not affect the proposed road layout it is recommended to support the proposed subdivision as access from these lots are via the existing Narrakine Road.

#### Public Open Space (POS)

The proposed overall subdivision plan (Attachment 3) did not allocate an area for the future public open space. A condition of subdivision approval had previously been imposed requiring the landowner to provide an area of land equivalent to 10% of the gross subdividable area. In the event that the area of POS is not provided, the applicant will be required to provide a cash in lieu contribution equivalent to 10% of the gross subdividable area.

#### Reticulated Sewer

There is currently no provision for reticulated sewer on the site. The Department of Health requires a minimum lot area of 2000m2 for residential lots for onsite waste disposal via Aerated Treatment Units (ATU) with nutrient stripping capacity. A condition of subdivision can be imposed requiring that all single houses and ancillary outbuildings connected to an onsite effluent disposal system shall be ATU's with nutrient stripping capacity.

#### **Contaminated Sites**

The applicant in its submission stated that the subject site may be contaminated due to current use of the land for the purpose of a Bus Depot and chemical treatment by Western Power with its infrastructure. This can be overcome through a condition requiring the developer to undertake investigation of the site for soil and groundwater contamination to determine if remediation work is required

Based on the above, it is recommended that Council supports the proposed subdivision subject to the conditions provided in the recommendation.

#### Consultation

 Not required as this is a referral from the Western Australian Planning Commission seeking comments from the relevant government agencies.

D1 - Delegated Authority - The Chief Executive Officer is granted delegated authority to conditionally support the subdivision of land into not more than 5 lots, the amalgamation of not more than 2 lots zoned Single Residential and the amalgamation of any number of lots within all other zones identified by the Scheme in accordance with Policy D2.

#### Financial Implications

The creation of new residential lots will increase the rate income to the Shire as each new lot will attract the minimum rate.

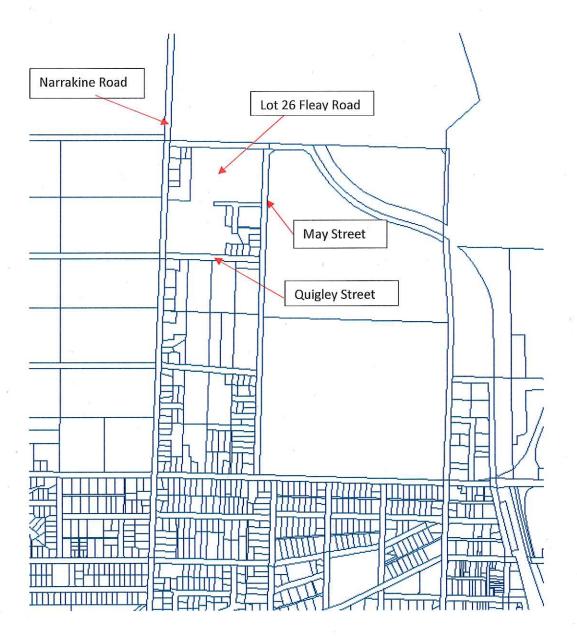

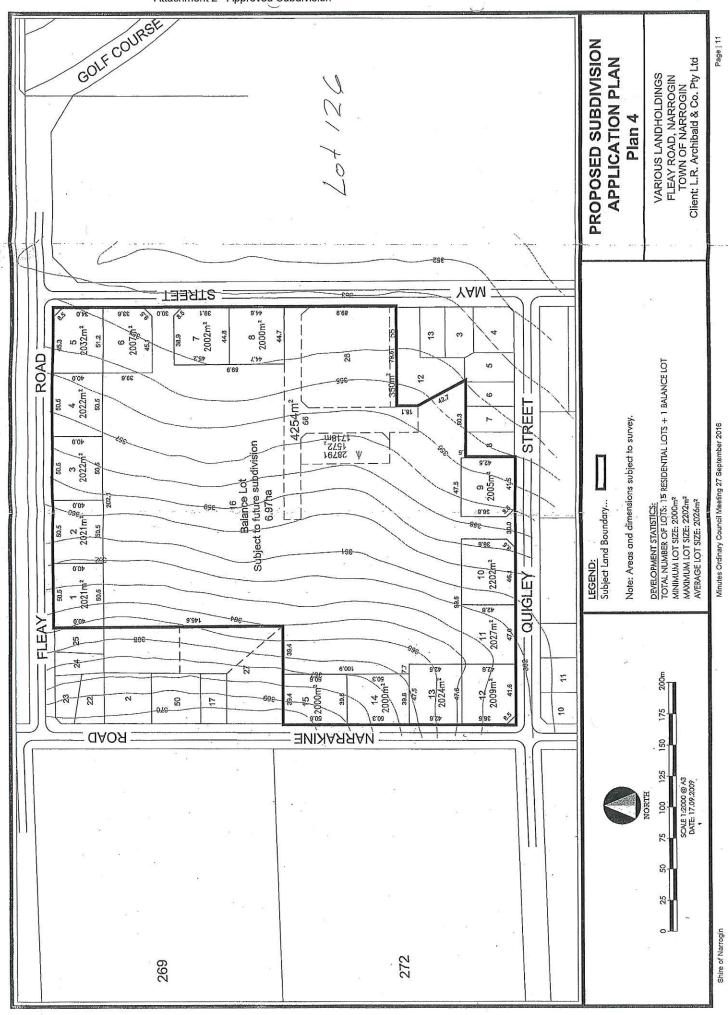
- The land being filled and/or drained at the subdivider's cost to the satisfaction of the Western Australian Planning Commission and any easements and/or reserves necessary for the implementation thereof, being granted free of cost.
- 2. The land being graded and stabilised to the satisfaction of the Shire.
- 3. Street corners within the subdivision are to be truncated to the standard truncation of 8.5 metres.
- 4. Arrangements being made with the local government for the applicant to upgrade Quigley Street, Fleay Road, May Street and Narrakine Road.
- 5. A dual use path being constructed by the applicant on May and Quigley Streets with the precise alignment and extent of construction being to the satisfaction and specifications of the Shire.
- 6. A detailed plan demonstrating dual use path/cycleway design to the specifications of the local government is to be submitted prior to the commencement of site works.
- 7. A landscaping and street tree plan being prepared and implemented to the satisfaction of the West Australian Planning Commission.

- 8. Suitable arrangements being made with the Water Corporation so that provision of a suitable water supply service will be available to lot(s) shown on the approved plan of subdivision.
- 9. An area(s) of land equivalent to 10 percent of the gross subdividable area, in a position to be agreed with the WAPC, being shown on the Deposited Plan as a "Reserve for Recreation" and vested in the Crown under Section 152 of the Planning and Development Act 2005, such land to be ceded free of cost and without any payment of compensation by the Crown. (Application for payment of cash in lieu can be made).
- 10. Prior to the commencement of subdivisional works an Urban Water Management Plan is to be prepared and approved in consultation with the Department of Water.
- 11. A stormwater management and disposal plan being developed and submitted to the satisfaction of the Shire.
- 12. Prior to commencement of subdivision works, investigation for soil and groundwater contamination is to be carried out to determine if remediation work is required.
- 13. A Bushfire Management Plan being prepared, approved and relevant provisions implemented during subdivision works, in accordance with WAPC's *Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas*.
- 14. No further subdivision is permitted without an overall Subdivision Plan for Lot 26 Fleay Road, Narrogin.
- 15. All single houses and ancillary outbuildings connected to an onsite effluent disposal system shall be Aerated Treatment Units (ATU's) with nutrient stripping capacity.

#### 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Financial activity are:

#### (a) Basis of Accounting

This statement is a special purpose financial report, prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Local Government Act 1995 (as amended) and accompanying regulations (as amended).

#### (b) The Local Government Reporting Entity

All Funds through which the Council controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this statement.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the statement, but a separate statement of those monies appears at Note 12.

#### (c) Rounding Off Figures

All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

#### (d) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets com obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon receipt of the rates.

#### (e) Goods and Services Tax

In accordance with recommended practice, revenues, expenses and assets capitalised are stated net of any GST recoverable. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of applicable GST.

#### (f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and cash equivalents as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are included as short-term borrowings in current liabilities.

#### (g) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables, which generally have 30 - 90 day terms, are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less any allowance for uncollectible amounts.

Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectible.

#### (h) Inventories

#### General

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs of necessary to make the sale.

Inventories held from trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months.

## 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

## Land Held for Resale

Land purchased for development and/or resale is valued at the lower of the cost and net realisable value. Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development and interest incurred on the financing of that land during its development. Interest and holding charges incurred after development is complete are recognised as expenses.

Revenue arising from the sale of property is recognised in the operating statement as at the time of signing a binding contract of sale.

Land held for resale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

## (i) Fixed Assets

**Buildings** 

All assets are initially recognised at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the local government includes the cost of all materials used in the construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

Certain asset classes may be revalued on a regular basis such that the carrying values are not materially different from fair value. Assets carried at fair value are to be revalued with sufficient regularity to ensure the carrying amount does not differ materially from that determined using fair value at reporting date.

## (j) Depreciation of Non-Current Assets

All non-current assets having a limited useful life are systematically depreciated over their useful lives in a manner which reflects the consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in those assets.

Depreciation is recognised on a straight-line basis, using rates which are reviewed each reporting period. Major depreciation rates and periods are:

## (k) Trade and Other Payables

provided to the local government prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Shire becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

## (1) Employee Benefits

The provisions for employee benefits relates to amounts expected to be paid for long service leave,

- (i) Wages, Salaries, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Short-term Benefits) be settled within 12 months represents the amount the Shire has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees services provided to balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on remuneration rates the Shire expects to pay and includes related on-costs.
- (ii) Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Long-term Benefits)

  The liability for long service leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits and measured as the the reporting date using the project unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and salary levels, experience of employee departures and periods of service. Expected future payments are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows. Where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, the liability is recognised as a current liability.

## (m) Interest-bearing Loans and Borrowings

All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the fair value of the consideration received less directly attributable transaction costs.

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities that are yield related are included as part of the carrying amount of the loans and borrowings.

## (n) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs are recognised as an expense when incurred except where they are directly attributable capitalised as part of the cost of the particular asset.

Provisions are recognised when: The council has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is more likely than not that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses. is determined by considering the class of obligations as a whole. A provision is recognised even if the likelihood of an outflow with respect to any one of item included in the same class of obligations may be small.

## (o) Current and Non-Current Classification

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities where Council does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for resale where it is held as non current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

## 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

## (p) Nature or Type Classifications

### Rates

All rates levied under the Local Government Act 1995. Includes general, differential, specific area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears, service charges and sewerage rates.

## **Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions**

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

## Non-Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

## **Profit on Asset Disposal**

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

## Fees and Charges

Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, sewerage rates, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

## Service Charges

Service charges imposed under Division 6 of Part 6 of the Local Government Act 1995. Regulation 54 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 identifies these are television and radio broadcasting, underground electricity and neighbourhood surveillance services. Exclude rubbish removal charges. Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

## **Interest Earnings**

Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

## Other Revenue / Income

Other revenue, which can not be classified under the above headings, includes dividends, discounts, rebates etc.

## **Employee Costs**

All costs associate with the employment of person such as salaries, wages, allowances, benefits such as vehicle and housing, superannuation, employment expenses, removal expenses, relocation expenses, worker's compensation insurance, training costs, conferences, safety expenses, medical examinations, fringe benefit tax, etc.

## **Materials and Contracts**

All expenditures on materials, supplies and contracts not classified under other headings. These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as contract services, consultancy, information technology, rental or lease expenditures.

## (p) Nature or Type Classifications (Continued)

## Utilities (Gas, Electricity, Water, etc.)

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

### Insurance

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

## Loss on asset disposal

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets.

## Depreciation on non-current assets

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

## Interest expenses

Interest and other costs of finance paid, including costs of finance for loan debentures, overdraft accommodation and refinancing expenses.

## Other expenditure

Statutory fees, taxes, provision for bad debts, member's fees or levies including WA Fire Brigade Levy and State taxes. Donations and subsidies made to community groups.

## (q) Statement of Objectives

In order to discharge its responsibilities to the community, the Council has developed a set of operational and financial objectives. These objectives have been established both on an overall basis and for each of its broad activities/programs.

Council operations as disclosed in this statement encompass the following service orientated activities/programs:

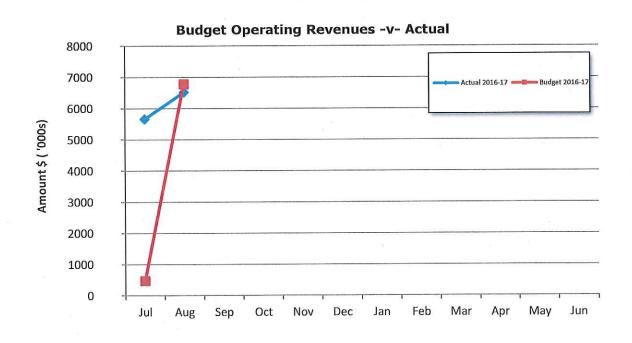

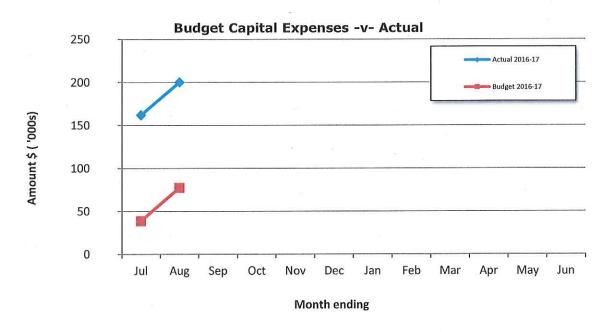

## Summary

The Bush Fires Act requires Council to appoint Fire Control Officers from time to time, as well as a Chief BFCO, and Deputy Chief BFCO. If more than one DCBFCO is appointed, seniority or area of authority must be specified.

## Background

Under the Bush Fires Act, an FCO has significant authority, and in a fire emergency, they may assume responsibility for the situation, as their authority overrides that of any volunteer on the ground, including the Brigade Captain. A Brigade Captain is elected by the Brigade and is not subject to Council approval, so their authority as Captain is limited to the Brigade area adopted by Council.

It is open to Council to specify that the election of the Captain of a Brigade is subject to confirmation by Council. This option has been recommended by the CBFCO, and will be noted for consideration for the proposed Bush Fire Brigades Local Law.

In turn, any FCO including CBFCO, may have their authority superseded by a Department of Fire and Emergency Services Liaison Officer or a Department of Parks and Wildlife Forestry Officer in certain situations.

## Comment

There is no restriction on the number of FCOs that may be appointed, or requirement to specify an area of operation for each.

Appointments by the former Shire of Narrogin have implied that each Fire Control Officer is linked to a Bush Fire Brigade, but unless specified, their authority extends throughout the whole of the district. It is proposed that this arrangement continue, without specific limitation.

General limitations are proposed to all FCOs, other than CBFCO, CEO and EMDRS -

- DCBFCO Rural and rural based FCOs, to have authority within the rural area only,

- DCBFCO Urban to have authority within the urban area only, noting that the FCO role is separate to all other functions as Ranger,
- Relief Ranger is restricted to issue of burning permits within urban area only.

One of the major tasks of an FCO is the issue of burning permits during the restricted burning periods at the opening and closing of the fire season. The authority for issue of permits has now been set with the adoption of Delegations –

- 5.1 Issue of burning permits CEO
- 20.1 Issue of burning permits Fire Control Officers

A critically important task of the FCOs is to review weather conditions and determine whether or not a harvest ban and movement of vehicles ban should be imposed, and when they are to be lifted. The CBFCO coordinates advice from a number of FCOs around the Shire. This harvest ban advice group is one method of obtaining the views of a range of people, and does not require Council direction, but is suggested that it be left to the discretion of the CBFCO.

An FCO is required to act within any restrictions or conditions placed on the role by Council. They cannot issue instructions to staff to carry out works, nor do they have the authority to hire plant or contractors.

- Staff members and any plant they are operating at the time may be required by an FCO to cease the work they are doing. But any instructions to staff to carry out fire fighting works such as clearing firebreaks with a grader or loader, or transport of equipment, must come through the usual channels from the Manager Operations or more senior officer.
- Hire of plant and contractors for fire fighting is addressed by Delegation 5.2 Fire Fighting
   Emergency Plant Hire to the CEO, who has made a secondary delegation as permitted by the Local Government Act to DCCS, EMTRS and EMDRS. This restriction is not in contradiction to the power of an FCO under the Act s.39(1)(h).

Appointment of Fire Weather Officers is not proposed. A FWO has the authority to override an FCO's withdrawal of a burning permit where conditions between one part of the Shire and another vary, and the local circumstances allow. The CBFCO advises that he sees no need for appointments to this role.

Clover Burning Permit Officers are also addressed by Delegation 20.2 Issue of Clover Burning Permits, and are limited to the CBFCO and DCBFCO(R). Issue of these permits is during the prohibited period, subject to significant restrictions under the Act. Advice from the CBFCO is that these are now rarely requested.

Appointment of non-staff to a role having statutory authority as an authorised officer must be made by Council. The CEO has been delegated authority to appoint staff members under Delegation 1.1 Appointment of authorised persons, however, in this instance it is suggested that Council confirm the staff appointments as well.

It is common and advisable that dual FCOs are appointed. As a registered volunteer, they are automatically covered by the provisions of the Act and for insurance if fighting a fire in an adjoining Shire, but the Act also provides that volunteers at an emergency in the adjoining Shire are subject to the authority of any volunteer registered with a BFB in the area of the fire. It is therefore possible for a very experienced FCO from one Shire to be subject to the

directions of a very inexperienced volunteer in the emergency area. Appointment of dual FCOs addresses this potential imbalance of expertise. The authority of dual FCOs is generally restricted to emergency operations, and do not issue permits, but this is a decision for Council.

A listing of those proposed to be nominated to other Shires is attached, following discussion with the CBFCO.

Adjoining Shires are to be requested to nominate or confirm prior nominations.

A FCO's statutory authority is greater than that of a Brigade Captain, but it should be noted that an FCO does not automatically assume the Incident Control function. Control may be transferred to the FCO at the decision of the person on the ground, or required to be transferred by the FCO.

As officers of Council, exercising statutory authority and powers on behalf of Council, there is an obligation on Council to consider the suitability of a person prior to appointment as an FCO. In this regard, Council should note the requirement of the proposed Bush Fire Brigades Local Law that FCO are to complete an FCO course or refresher at least once every 5 years, for their appointment to remain valid.

Nomination from the FCO Meeting, or by an adjoining Shire does not mean automatic right to the role. Appointment becomes effective only on resolution of Council.

From the former Shire appointments, two changes are made to the Ockley Brigade -
