Community Capacity Building, Training and Education

Mental health and suicide prevention training, education and support for healthcare professionals and community partners.

Eclipse Program

A safe, non-judgemental virtual support group for people in the Wheatbelt who have survived a suicide attempt.

Head to Health

Mental health support for adults with their own or another's mild to moderate mental ill health.

Individual Counselling

One-to-one counselling in a safe, caring, and non-judgemental environment for individuals, couples and families impacted by alcohol, other drugs, or related mental ill health.

Integrated Support Team

Case management, peer, and GP support for people with complex and ongoing support needs, complementing existing counselling and pharmacotherapy services.

WA Diversion Program

Breaking the cycle of offending by providing counselling that helps offenders, with AOD-related concerns, address their use and related harm.

• Wheatbelt AOD Prevention Services

Coordination and support of stakeholders, organisations and community groups in the development, implementation, and evaluation of AOD harm minimisation initiatives, including community events, community wellbeing plans and the creation and promotion of educational campaigns and training opportunities. Further oversight of the Wheatbelt VSU Incident Reporting Program.

Wheatbelt Suicide Prevention Services

Promoting wellbeing, reducing risk factors, and enhancing protective factors at a community level to prevent the development of suicidal behaviour.

Aftercare Co-ordinator (Suicide Postvention)

Personalised support and case management for people following a suicide attempt, available throughout the Wheatbelt.

Fresh Start

Northam Recovery Program

Our Northam residential treatment program offers clients 24 hr care in a supportive environment away from triggers and negative influences, which decreases the likelihood of relapse. Both residents and staff members participate in a Modified Therapeutic Community model in addition to regular and ongoing group therapy programs that help establish healthy behaviour and thought patterns.

Northam Recovery Program is a comprehensive residential program focused on recovery. Residents commence their recovery journey at Northam Recovery Centre and, on completion, can move to The Hill for the next phase of treatment. Both facilities have the same core program, but with differing activities, programs, and responsibilities.

Clients interested in entering the Northam Recovery Program meet with a case coordinator and receive an information brochure and some basic information about the program. Potential residents and former clients who want to engage or return to the Northam Recovery Program can attend a weekly Outreach program at our Subiaco clinic.

Following assessment, patients are required to complete the following steps before progressing to Northam:

- Northam Intake & Assessment paperwork
- Medical assessment
- Outreach Program
- Suitability assessment (if applicable)
- Mental Health Care Plan
- UDS (Urine Drug Screen which must be clear of all illicit substances)
- Legal issues (current and previous)
- NRP Rent Paperwork (Centrelink set up)
- First 2 weeks rent paid upfront
- Ambulance cover
- Up-to date Covid 19 vaccine status certificate provided

Once all steps of the process are completed, clients are able to make the transition to Northam where the next part of their recovery journey begins.

Northam Recovery Centre

The Northam Recovery Centre is where residents will commence their recovery journey.

Each resident is allocated their own bedroom with storage for personal belongings. All rooms have both air-conditioners and heaters, and linen is provided for the duration of their stay. All meals are prepared and delivered fresh daily.

The Centre is a 3-story centre with sleeping quarters, common areas, gardens and vegetable patch. There is also a range of art supplies provided for residents who want to explore and develop their creative talents.

Residents may use the gym and other sporting and educational facilities in Northam during designated program times.

The program runs on a structured timetable with groups, free time, meals, and chores. Maintenance of the property is an important part of the program, and all residents assist with normal household tasks including cooking, cleaning, gardening, and general maintenance.

Residents are encouraged to invite their families to visit them on Family Day, held on the last Saturday of each month at our second facility, The Hill.

The Hill

The Hill is located 8 km outside Northam on an expansive 85-acre rural property. This stage of the program provides incentive and opportunity for residents to build their skills and make changes to manage their recovery in a supportive environment.

Once the residents have completed their program at the Northam Recovery Centre, they have the opportunity to graduate to The Hill to complete the work readiness program. There, the residents will

benefit from a country lifestyle, learning practical skills with a strong emphasis on returning to work. Residents living at The Hill will play an active role in our Social Enterprises.

2. Mental Health Services

Wheatbelt Mental Health

The Wheatbelt Mental Health Service provides free, confidential, quality, community mental health care to people in the region.

This includes comprehensive assessment and treatment for people with mental health problems, as well as training and support to other organisations and professionals.

Aboriginal Mental Health Program

An Aboriginal mental health program offered for all ages in the Wheatbelt region. By combining concepts of social and emotional wellbeing and Aboriginal ways of working, Aboriginal Mental Health Workers improve treatment outcomes for Aboriginal clients within both community mental health services and inpatient care.

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service

The Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service has a multidisciplinary team to assist young people up to 18 years of age and their families who live in the Wheatbelt. The service offers specialised assessment, treatment and support to children, youth and their families and carers who are experiencing emotional and/or mental health problems.

Youth Mental Health Program

The Wheatbelt Youth Mental Health Service provides confidential assessment, treatment, and management of mental health issues for people aged between 15 and 24 years old. The team helps to establish links with community mental health organisations and support long-term positive mental health.

Adult Mental Health Service

The Wheatbelt Adult Mental Health Service provides confidential assessment, treatment, and management of mental health issues for people aged between 18 and 65 years old in the region.

Seniors Mental Health Service

The Wheatbelt Mental Health Service provides support for people aged 65 and over, or 55 and over for Aboriginal people, who have existing mental health issues, dementia related difficulties and long-term mental health disorders.

Luminos Project

The Luminos Project is set up to support young people aged 16-24 who are willing and able to meaningfully and safely work on their suicidal ideation in a 4–5-day residential sanctuary environment in inner city Perth. The program aims to facilitate sustainable recovery and growth from suicidal ideation and behaviour by providing a safe therapeutic space to explore what may be contributing to and behind these challenges; and build skills, connections, resources and hope to better cope with and address these challenges.

The program integrates the ASIST and Suicide to Hope frameworks with clinical psychology and counselling input from intake and brings in DBT skills and formal and informal counselling opportunities throughout. The group sessions only focus on DBT skills building (not exploring SI), however one-to-one sessions are available to explore SI more deeply. DBT skills and emotional support are integrated into all house activities, including the exploration of the surrounding area (Nature etc), relaxation and downtime. All clients are supported with integrated safety plans and discharge plans that are informed by ASIST, Suicide to Hope and clinical input, with referrals provided to other services as needed.

As an early intervention service, they do not have the capacity to hold young people who are unable to stay safe in the house, or with complex or acute risk presentations that would prevent safe and meaningful engagement in the service; and/or young people who would be better supported by another service (e.g. hospital inpatient or psychiatric services). They do however assess clients' suitability on a case-by-case basis. The intake process starts with a young person filling out a pre-intake form (link below) and is conducted via multiple phone calls over a 1-2 week process (sometimes longer). It can therefore take from one week (to multiple) for young people

to enter the house, and this depends on multiple factors. If Ruah Community Services feel they are not the best fit for a young person's needs, they will always facilitate re-direction to more appropriate supports/ services.

3. Family and Domestic Violence Services

Share and Care

• Family and Domestic Violence Child Support

A trained child support worker is on site and will relieve the parent of care if she needs to attend appointments.

The support may include outings with the parents' permission, liaison with schools for enrolments, play therapy, referrals for mother and or child to a host of other agencies that may assist with the variety of needs the consumer presents with.

These services cover the Wheatbelt and Upper Great Southern, based in Northam and Narrogin.

• Family & Domestic Violence Co-ordinated Response Service

This team will participate in a joint assessment of Family and Domestic Violence Incident Reports with Police and Department of Communities (Child Protection Services), to achieve victim safety and perpetrator accountability.

- Participate in the assessment using the Common Risk Assessment and Risk Management Framework.
- Participate in triage of responses with Department for Child Protection & Police
- Participate in a multi-agency response for high-risk cases.
- Referrals to appropriate services i.e. Safe at Home.

This service covers the Wheatbelt.

Narrogin Outreach Counselling Service

This program offers outreach support to women who have recently utilised the Women's Refuge or feel they need support to work through Family & Domestic Violence issues in their existing relationships.

Our Support Workers maintain confidentiality, are highly skilled and will provide women with referrals to other agencies, court support and teach daily living skills where requested. Support for the clients is ongoing until the client indicates the support is no longer required.

Rainbow Women's Centre, Narrogin

Provides safe accommodation for women & children escaping domestic or family violence and homeless women. Referrals for financial assistance, medical issues, legal matters, and transport to safe accommodation.

Consumers can access the refuge 24 hours, 7 days a week on the freecall crisis line 1800 007 570, this line is answered by fully trained support workers.

The refuge can accommodate up to three families in a communal style living arrangement. On exiting the refuge clients are offered an outreach service, which may include programs and emotional or physical support and referrals to other agencies. Financial support for emergency food is available on a limited situation, while residing at the refuge.

Support workers provide clients with programs which include safety plans, goal setting, budgeting, the cycle of violence, self-esteem and the effects of family and domestic violence has on children. Limited transport is available for access to safe accommodation or appointments etc.

This service covers the Upper Great Southern.

Magnolia Women's Centre, Northam

For women escaping Family or Domestic Violence and their children. The refuge can accommodate 2 single women and large families, featuring four family rooms and a total of ten beds, in separate fully equipped unit style accommodation.

The refuge operates 24 hours 7 days per week, the support staff are contactable on 1800 353 122. This is a free and confidential service. This number can be use for telephone support and counselling, to obtain transport to get to safe accommodation or information packages on family and domestic violence.

The refuge is monitored daily with a duress alarm system and safety gates to ensure safe supported accommodation.

The worker may be able to be of assistance in regard to court appearances for violence restraining order or family court issues. The worker can provide basic counselling and outreach support if

accommodation is not required. The refuge provides programs for women on budgeting, goal setting, safety plans, the effects family and domestic violence has on children, self-esteem, and the cycle of violence.

This service covers the Wheatbelt.

Safe at Home

Safe at Home provides specialist workers to assess safety and support the needs of women and children to remain in their homes, where it is safe to do so after a Family and Domestic Violence incident or ongoing violence in the home.

Once a referral or WAPOL incident report is provided this service completes a comprehensive risk and safety assessment, security audit and planning to allow women to make an informed decision in relation to remaining in their home or to accessing crisis accommodation should the situation be unsafe. The service also provides links into other agencies. The service has the ability to access limited funds to provide increased safety at the home.

The Safe at Home staff will also assist with support to apply for a Family Violence Restraining Order and offer support during the court process. Outreach support is available across the Wheatbelt to ensure ongoing support.

5. Housing/Homelessness Services

Department of Communities

The Department of Communities operates across the construction, property finance and human services sectors to create affordable housing opportunities for people who would otherwise have difficulty accessing appropriate housing.

Housing options available to Western Australians who have a housing need and receive a low to moderate income, include:

- Public Housing

Communities provides rental accommodation to eligible households across Western Australia. Rent is calculated at 25 per cent of gross assessable household income.

- Bond Assistance Loans

The Department of Communities offers bond assistance and two weeks' rent in advance as an interest-free loan to help people obtain accommodation in the private rental market.

Emergency Accommodation Program

This program assists persons who are at risk of becoming homeless or who are homeless and offers:

- Short term crisis, hostel/hotel/motel accommodation for the homeless.
- Information and referral to other services to assist in meeting the ongoing needs of homeless persons.
- Assistance with part payments of bonds and/or ingoing costs

Homeless Support Service

This service is designed to assist those that are threatened with losing their homes due to financial difficulties, those who are homeless and need support to obtain and maintain long term housing and those who are finding it challenging to remain in one home for any extended amount of time.

This service networks closely with the Department of Housing, Emergency Relief services and Financial Counsellors, Supported Housing services through Avon Youth, our Men's Lodge and other local agencies.

This program is designed to assist women and children who are homeless.

The program works with the client base towards obtaining and maintaining housing into the future.

Whilst in Jacaranda House, based in Northam, women are offered education, information, and support.

The Lodge is designed to provide safe secure accommodation to Homeless men from age 18+. Men accommodated in the Lodge can expect to receive assistance with a range of services including:

- Department of Housing and assistance with immediate needs such as food, housing, medical, clothing etc.

Commonwealth Psychosocial Support Program (CPS)

Strong Women, Strong Families

This program offers a series of six-week support and training courses throughout the year, for young mothers and their children.

Emerging Artists Program

This series of 8-week courses is targeted at Aboriginal men who want to join our respected Elder and artist, Francis Bolton, in the bush to learn craft skills.

Narrogin Cultural Arts Program

The Narrogin Cultural Arts Program aims to enhance and promote the artistic and cultural expression of the Wilman people of Narrogin.

Narrogin Community Centre

The Narrogin Community Centre is a space for clients to enjoy activities for clients such as yarning circles, morning teas, men's groups, women's groups and training and education.

Thrive Public Housing Program

"Thrive" is a program to assist public housing tenants to look after and retain their housing accommodation. This program is funded by the State Department of Communities. In Northam and Narrogin, the program is run jointly by Keedac with Wanslea Family Services.

Intensive Family Support (IFSS)

The Intensive Family Support Service (IFSS) works with families whose children are at imminent risk of going into care. Keedac is the ACCO providing cultural support for the program, which provides practical parenting, education, and skills development for parents and/or birth families, focusing on living skills, child mental health, education, safety and protective skills.

Family Care Service (FCS)

The Family Care Support service (FCSS) helps grandcarers and others who are looking after family member's children because they can no longer care for them. Otherwise known as kinship care, this rapid change in circumstances can feel overwhelming for new carers, but support is available from this program.
