### ~ Council Decisions ~

Council decisions made at the Ordinary Council meeting held on 23 April 2025

### **Proposed Freehold Acquisition of 38** Furnival Street, Reserve 85457

The Council authorised the purchase of Reserve 85457, from the State Government, located at 38 Furnival Street, comprising 2 lots totalling 2478 sqm, zoned residential, for \$185,000 plus GST, with a view to future housing development. An amendment to the Shire's 2024/25 Annual Budget was made, increasing both land acquisition and reserve income allocations by \$132,000 to accommodate the purchase.

### Narrogin CBD Building Facades **Colour Palette Project Fund**

The Council approved a revised grant structure for the CBD Building Facades Colour Palette Project, offering matching grants between \$2,500 to \$7,500 for larger buildings. They also agreed to introduce an Expressions of Interest process and explore potential government funding for the CBD revitalisation. A \$10,000 provision for project assistance will be included in the 2025/26 Budget deliberations to support business or

#### **Draft Council Policy - Concessions** on Commercial and Farming Properties Owner-Occupied by Pensioners and Seniors

The Council adopted a new policy providing concessions for pensioners and seniors on owner-occupied commercial and farming properties, limiting house curtilage to 2 hectares. The policy will be incorporated into the Council Policy Manual and made available on the Shire's website.

### Narrogin Dance Centre Request

The Council resolved to retain the current fees and charges agreement with Narrogin Dance Centre for hire fees of the Narrogin Town Hall until December 2025. This extension provides the Dance Centre with time to consider the impact on clients and programming. The proposed new hire fees will be considered as part of the 2025/26 Schedule of Fees and Charges.

# **Highbury Rest Area Upgrade**

The recent upgrade of the Highbury Rest Area, now sealed with bitumen, provides a safer and more comfortable space for travellers. This project, funded equally by the Shire and Main Roads WA, enhances road safety and convenience for all road users

### **Railway Precinct Pathway** Project

The first stage of the Railway Precinct Pathway has been completed, creating a vital link between the Narrogin CBD and the Narrogin and Dryandra Visitor Centre. Made possible by a \$50,000 Streets Alive Grant and matching Shire funding, the project will see further enhancements, including interpretive signage, landscaping, and a PM 706 replica artwork, with completion set for June 2026.

# Campaign

The 2024/25 Concrete Footpath Campaign is well underway, bringing new footpaths to key areas across Narrogin. Funded through the Federal Government's Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program, this initiative is designed to improve safety and connectivity within the community.


