Summary

Council is requested to consider the adoption of the Shire's 2015/16 Budget Review.

Background

The Shire's CEO has requested the Town of Narrogin's Director of Corporate & Community Services to assist with the preparation of the 2015/16 Budget Review.

As part of the Budget Review, Shire Officers have been asked to review the financial reports on 31 January 2016 and project actual income and expenditure to 30 June 2016. The 2015/16 Budget Review was completed on 10 March 2016.

The legal requirement of an annual budget review is shown under the *Statutory Environment* section of this report.

Comment

When projecting year-end figures, a conservative approach was taken to determine the likely year-end actuals e.g. overestimate expenditure and underestimate income.

During the 2015/16 Budget Review the following items had been assessed and are considered noteworthy.

Brought Forward Estimated Surplus

The brought forward Estimated Surplus figure of \$1,824,946 that had been included in the 2015/16 Budgeted Rate Setting Statement does equal the closing Estimated Surplus in the

2014/15 Financial Report. Therefore it is not anticipated that there will be any adverse impact on the Shire's budget as no movements to the amount is expected.

Nature & Type

Although the nature & type calculations appear reasonable in the budget, it should be noted that the calculation of Employee Costs and Materials & Contracts cannot be supported by budget working papers.

The approach taken by the Shire to cost most of the Works programs was simply to apply a lump sum figure. There was only a few projects that had working papers that show the amount of employee costs, plant costs and material & contracts that had been allocated to the Works. The concern of not having detailed working papers for each project/job is that the purchasing officer has no ability to know exactly how much discretionary expenditure there actually is in a particular job for example the purchase of contractors or materials for the project.

Overheads

The Shire has budgeted \$650,000 for Plant Operation Costs (POC), however, there is no budget document which would indicate where the majority of these costs have been allocated. It has been estimated that POC will likely be reduced to \$635,000. The Shire is over allocating its POC (by \$30,000) to various works and services which will require a further review to reduce the current charge out rates to a more appropriate level.

The budget also included an overhead allocation of \$633,200 for Public Works Overheads (PWO), however, there is no budget document which would indicate where the majority of these costs have been allocated. PWO are allocated to various works and services via the Shire's payroll based on the number of hours that has been worked by depot-based staff. The Shire is over allocating the PWO (by \$120,000) to various works and services which will require a further review to reduce the current overhead percentage to a more appropriate level.

Due to resignation of key Finance Staff, the monthly allocation of Administration Overheads has not been carried out for a number of months. Although there is a significant increase in administration salaries due to the payment of employee benefits to the previous CEO, the rest of the costs are to be expended to meet budget expectations. Therefore no detailed assessment has been undertaken in this area. The Town of Narrogin will assist the Shire with this matter once suitable resources become available.

Depreciation

As for reasons already mentioned, the monthly allocation of depreciation has not been carried out for a number of months. Therefore no detailed assessment has been undertaken in this area. The Town of Narrogin will assist the Shire with this matter once suitable resources become available.

The Shire has only budgeted \$520,500 for the deprecation of its road network, however a valuation report has been received from Talis Consulting that had estimated the annual depreciation for the Shire's roads network to be \$2.7 million. This level of increase in deprecation will have a significant impact on the Shire's Statement of Comprehensive Income

as it is likely that only substantial Net Operating Losses will now be achieved on an annual basis.

Operating Accounts (Excluding Works Program)

The majority of operating income and expenditure accounts are expected to meet budget expectations. However the following accounts are expected to have permanent variances at year end:

•	Financial Assistant Grants – Local Roads – Income	\$(34,000)
•	General Interest – Income	\$(4,000)
•	Town Planning Application Fee – Income	\$6,000
•	Waste Management Plan – Expenditure	\$(5,000)
•	Town Planning Control – Expenditure	\$3,000
•	Depot Maintenance – Expenditure	\$33,500
•	Administration Salary & Wages – Expenditure	\$100,000
•	Fuels & Oils (POC) – Expenditure	\$(15,000)

The net impact on the Shire's budget is expected to be a decrease in income of \$32,000 and an increase in expenditure of \$116,500. The Net Result of these transactions on cash flow would be a reduction of \$148,500.

Capital Accounts (Excluding Works Program)

The Shire has purchased and sold its budgeted Plant and Equipment items with a net savings of \$17,059. The budgeted Land and Buildings is expected to be on budget except with regards to the upgrade works to 13 Hough Street (\$50,000) as this project will not commence this financial year.

The renovation works to 13 Hough Street has been delayed due to concerns about the required ongoing maintenance due to the continual movement of the clay subsurface and its suitability of having an executive standard house in this particular location. It is recommended that the \$50,000 be transferred to the Shire's Property Maintenance Reserve Account at year end which will allow for further discussions about the future of this property.

Works Program

It is not possible to review individual projects/works to the 'nature' or 'type' level to determine if they are within budget estimates e.g. employee costs, material and contracts. However it can be determined that the following catalogues of costs have been budgeted over the whole works program:

•	Direct Wages & PWO	\$1,307,350
•	POC	\$650,000
•	Material & Contracts	\$3,037,858

The following Municipal-funded Road Projects will not be commenced by the end of the financial year:

•	Clayton Road – Pavement Repairs	\$54,000 *
•	Cooraminning/Wanerie Roads – Pavement Repairs	\$74,000 *
•	Chomley Road - Edge Repair & Reseal	\$10,000
	SAVINGS (Removing Reserves Transfers)	\$57,375

^{*} Partly funded from the Road Construction Reserve

The Shire does not expect to generate the \$200,000 surplus that was included in the budget from the Main Roads Link Road Stage 2 Construction. It is more likely this project will achieve a smaller surplus of around \$40,000.

The Wanerie Road construction project is funded from the Royalties for Regions scheme to the value of \$1,008,168. This project is now expected to be completed at a cost of only \$801,000, which will leave an unexpended grant of \$207,168. Any unexpended grant on this project must be returned to the State.

A summary of the anticipated Works Program variances:

^{*}The reduction in the above Grant Income and Reserve Transfer will be offset by an equal reduction in expenditure. Therefore these items are not expected to have an adverse impact on the Shire's cash flow position at Year End.

Conclusion

It is anticipated that the Shire will achieve a net surplus of \$150,434 for the 2015/16 financial year. There is no recommendation to amend the budget to include additional works or services as the Shire already has an extensive works program and any additional items would likely remain uncompleted at year end.

The Shire will need to reallocate the administration overheads as well as process the outstanding depreciation runs of its fixed assets. The Town can assist the Shire with these matters as there are three current Finance Officers who are proficient in QuickBooks.

The Shire will need to review the POC and POW allocations as they are currently adding unnecessary costs to various works and service.

Statutory Environment

The Local Government Act 33A - Review of budget

- (1) Between 1 January and 31 March in each financial year a local government is to carry out a review of its annual budget for that year.
- (2A) The review of an annual budget for a financial year must
 - (a) consider the local government's financial performance in the period beginning on 1 July and ending no earlier than 31 December in that financial year; and
 - (b) consider the local government's financial position as at the date of the review; and
 - (c) review the outcomes for the end of that financial year that are forecast in the budget.
 - (2) Within 30 days after a review of the annual budget of a local government is carried out it is to be submitted to the council.
 - (3) A council is to consider a review submitted to it and is to determine* whether or not to adopt the review, any parts of the review or any recommendations made in the review.
 - *Absolute majority required.
 - (4) Within 30 days after a council has made a determination, a copy of the review and determination is to be provided to the Department.


Summary

An application has been lodged seeking approval for a beautician business to operate as a home occupation from an existing residence on Lot 164 (No 176) Yilliminning Road, Narrogin.

Background

Lot 164 contains an existing residence (and ancillary outbuildings), is used for agricultural purposes and has an approximately area of 67.435 hectares – Attachment 1.

The lot is located approximately 3 kilometres to the south east of Narrogin townsite – location plan below.



Lot 164 is zoned 'Farming' under the Shire of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No 2 ('the Scheme').

Comment

Description of Application

The applicant has advised as follows:

- The business would offer services of full body waxing, eyelash/eyebrow tinting and spray tanning.
- The applicant is a sole operator and the business will not entail employment of any other person.
- The business will operate approximately 10 hours per week on Tuesday Thursday.
- The business will operate from a 14.57m² room within the existing house, and there will be no retail sales.
- The operator has a Certificate III in Beauty Services.

A copy of the applicants letter is included as Attachment 2.

Home Occupation definition & Landuse Permissibility

As part of the planning assessment, Council has to determine the best fit landuse definition available under the Scheme.

It is recommended that the proposal be construed as a home occupation as follows:

A home occupation is listed as an 'AA' use in the Farming zone under 'Table 1 – Zoning Table' of the Scheme which means the use is not permitted unless the Council has granted planning approval.

Officer Comment

The proposed business is small scale, will be operated by a single operator, is on a large lot, will not negatively impact on amenity or continued agriculture in the area, complies with the home occupation definition and is generally supported.

Accordingly, conditional approval is recommended.

Consultation

Gray & Lewis has liaised with the Shire's Environmental Health Officer who confirmed there is no specific health legislation applicable to the proposed (waxing) activity, however there are Department of Health Guidelines.

No public consultation has been undertaken.

Statutory Environment

Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 –

The Regulations include 'deemed provisions' which effectively apply statewide and override any conflicting provisions contained in the Shire of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No 2 ('the Scheme').

Planning approval for the home occupation is required under Regulation 60 under Part 7 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.*

Council has discretion to advertise the application in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.

Shire of Narrogin Town Planning Scheme No 2 ('the Scheme') -

- Clause 4.9.1 states 'a planning approval to conduct a home occupation is issued to a
 specific occupier of a particular parcel of land, it shall not be transferred or assigned to
 any other person, and shall not be transferred from the land in respect to which it was
 granted. Should there be a change of the occupier of the land in respect of which
 planning approval for a home occupation is issued the planning approval is cancelled.'
- Clause 4.9.2 states that 'If, in the opinion of Council, a home occupation is causing a nuisance or annoyance to owners or occupiers of land in the locality the Council may rescind the planning approval.'
- Clause 4.12.2 states (in regards to development in the farming zone that 'the Council shall not grant planning approval for any development that will in the opinion of Council adversely affect the rural landscape or be contrary to the agricultural use of the land'.

It is presented to Council to consider endorsing a Regional Development Assistance Program (RDAP) Application for the development of the industrial land that the Town and Shire jointly purchased.

Background

The Town and the Shire of Narrogin purchased Lot 205 Mokine Road approximately two years ago for the intention of using the land for expanding the industrial area. This has not occurred to date and the land has been used to run horses and has now been leased for share cropping to the Hawks Football Club.

Comment

The RDAP applications open once a year and will close on 31 March 2016.

It is presented to endorse the attached application and commitments within this document to provide the land as part of the project and to provide earthworks and road work construction at cost to the project to make the project more viable.

If the application is accepted, Landcorp would process the development and would be responsible for all headworks charges, selling the land and hold all risk for potential losses made.

It must be noted that the earthworks and road construction are set to be charged at cost to encourage the project to occur as once the lots are developed they will then generate ongoing rates for the new Shire. If Council was to attempt to develop these blocks these works will be performed at cost and the Council would be at a far greater risk of losing money on the development.

The application is to develop nine lots being lot 1 to 9; however, they may wish to develop more or less and this consultation can occur later, as can the overall block designs and layout.

The ability to have Industrial Land available and ready to purchase will allow Council to sell Narrogin and promote future development which is essential to the progression of Narrogin as a developing regional centre.

Council will be required to subdivide the land out from Lot 205 Mokine Road and will also be obligated to change the purpose of the land use.


