Summary

The Narrogin District Townscape Committee are requested to review the four nominations received for the committee position of Community Member at Large, and recommend to Council a nominee for appointment to the Narrogin District Townscape Committee.

Background

At the Narrogin District Townscape Committee meeting held on 16 August 2018, it was noted that there remained two vacant positions on the Committee for a Community Member at large and an Indigenous representative. It was reported at the meeting held on 18 October 2018 that Mr Bolton had resigned from the Committee, leaving an additional vacancy for a person with expertise in the disability sector.

Comment

In October 2018 advertisements were placed in the Narrogin Observer, the Shire's website, Facebook page and email networks, inviting nominations for the committee positions of; Community Member at large, Indigenous representative, and disability services sector representative.

There were no nominations received for the Indigenous representative or the disability services sector representative. Four nominations were received for the position of Community Member at large.

The Terms of Reference adopted by Council on 26 September 2018 state that a number of Committees have members from specific community organisations or from the community at large.

For this Committee, Council will seek to appoint community members so that the Committee meetings will consist of members and deputy members having:

- a) demonstrated expertise and knowledge in the particular area of Committee responsibility;
- b) relevant skills and experience to provide independent advice;
- c) current participation with an organisation having similar objectives would be well regarded; and

- d) diverse backgrounds and experience, while remaining relevant to the Committee's functions.

Preference will be given to residents who have a detailed knowledge of the district, enabling Committee members to make a positive contribution towards the community. Non-residents may be appointed by Council, if suitable candidates cannot be established from the community or if it is determined there is specific need or advice that is required.

Nominations received from:

1. Mr Ian Fergus - expressed an interest in creating an economic and social benefit from and for a geographic hub in Narrogin, utilising location, history, tourism, engineering and education, in concert with initiatives relating to international relations. Ian draws experience from his involvement with China's Ministry of Machine Building and National Tourism Authority.
2. Mrs Vicki Chadwick - expressed interest in continually moving forward and improve on the town's aesthetics for future residents to move to the town and for visitors and tourists to appreciate what our community and town have to offer. Mrs Chadwick draws experience from her participation in various community groups and liaising with the Shire of Narrogin on a range of projects past and present.
3. Ms Geire Kami - expressed interest in townscape matters in her capacity as the manager of the Dryandra Country Visitor Centre (DCVC). Ms Kami draws experience from her role as the manager of the DCVC and through her studies.
4. Mrs Mary Martin - expressed an interest specifically in the Railway Dam upgrade and draws her experience from participation in committees and her interest in natural fauna and flora.

The ASO reported that contact had been made with Committee nominee Mrs Chadwick in relation to her experience in the disability sector and enquired if she was agreeable to nominate as the representative from the disability sector. The ASO invited Mrs Chadwick to nominate for the committee position of Community member at large (disability sector) to which Mrs Chadwick accepted the invitation.

The ASO explained to the Committee the purpose for this was to provide an opportunity to fill two of the three vacant committee positions from the received nominations for Community member at large. The Committee supported the recommendation to fill two committee positions and requested that the Shire seek to fill the remaining vacancy and re-advertise the position of Community member at large (Indigenous representative) in January 2019.

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



The Status Report has been updated with details of the projects from October and November 2018.

At the previous meeting, held on 18 October 2018, the Committee were requested to prioritise as High, Medium or Low projects from the recommended Core Values in the;

Highbury Townscape Plan:

- 1 Enhancement recommendations;
- 2 Stopover bay development formalising vehicle access and parking areas to reduce the expanse of open gravel;
- 3 Street verge improvements; and
- 4 Entry statement upgrades.

And the 2016 Narrogin Townscape Study Review Status Update Report:

1. Central Precinct;
2. Developing a civic and cultural heart;
3. Improve visitor experience;
4. Greening the CBD;
5. Walkability;
6. Parking; and
7. Consolidation of the CBD.

The Committee are asked to share their list of prioritised projects for updating the Status Report. After which, each of the Core Values will become the focus of future budget requests and project development and planning according to the priority rating recommended by the Townscape Committee.

There was some discussion by the Committee regarding the layout of and the language used in the Status Report, in particular the interpretation of the Core Values. The Committee were advised that a representative from H+H Architects will be visiting Narrogin on 17 January 2019 to discuss the proposed Colour Palette project. The Committee requested a meeting with H+H to allow them opportunity to discuss the 2016 Townscape Study Review and to gain some clarification in regards to the intended meaning of terms such as Core Values.

The consultant will be required to make a recommendation to the Shire as to the type of signage and its support structure(s) (i.e. pedestals / posts etc.) to be installed and the rationale for this. It is expected a contractor will be appointed by the end of November and this project should be completed by April/May 2019. 13.12.2018 - Contractor has been appointed and they will undertake a site visit in January 2019.
