4. GENERAL BUSINESS

4.1 Mr R Hayes – Downderry Wines, Graham Road, Narrogin

Mr Hayes addressed the meeting summarising his communications with the Shire and Council over the past few months in relation to his vineyard business.

My Hayes expressed that this year, he will not be producing any wine from his vineyard owing to the poor condition of his crop believed to be from Shire Trucks allegedly speeding near the intersection of Graham Road and Tarwonga Road, where his vineyard is planted. He announced that owing to a severe frost in November and the added dust from increased and speeding Shire traffic taking gravel from nearby pits for WANDRRA road work programme, he cannot produce a crop this year and he will have to close his business.

Mr Hayes made the following points:

- I asked for the dust to be suppressed with watering and this has not happened.
- I asked for Shire trucks to be instructed to do no more than 20km/hr when driving past the vineyard.
- We had a frost in November and it severely affected our yield.
- Our business has no choice to but close it's doors.
- I blame the Shire totally for this year's loss.
- I was asked if I was in fact watering them. I water them so much that I have powdery mildew.
- I cannot get the trucks to slow down.
- I have said several times I had no intention to litigate.
- Leigh, I want you to write the letters that you sign please. I admire what you and Aaron have done for this town.
- I had a meeting last Thursday with Shire President, Deputy Shire President and CEO after which I followed up with an email summarising our meeting, as was suggested by my Vineyard Lawyer.

- Today I sent a letter to the CEO and the CEO;s reply was that his view was that the record was not entirely correct that he would providing advice to him where it differed.
- In 12 months of hard work and I've got nothing and I blame the shire because they arrogantly ignored me for 12 months.
- I thank the Shire President and Deputy Shire President for the actions and intended road work, where the Shire is re-sheeting the road with gravel in front of my property.

4.2 B Whyte – Note 2(a) Transport

Mr Whyte enquired what the reference to 'Transport' under page 11 of the Annual Financial Report related to.

The Presiding Member advised that this was a reference to grants received for expenditure on Shire roads from Commonwealth and State Governments.
