The road has been reconstructed from the sub-base up, giving it a life span of another 15-20 years. The Town has re-addressed and rationalised how pedestrians used the street and included more direct pedestrian crossings areas. The Town rationalised garden beds making maintenance by our Works Crew more efficient and also opened up access to the side streets from both directions.

Summary

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) is seeking comments from the Town of Narrogin on a proposed survey strata on the subject land, prior to determining the application.

Background

The subject land is a 1,711m² vacant residential property located on the northern side of Northwood Street, approximately 30m west of the intersection between Northwood and Roe Streets.

The WAPC is in receipt of an application for approval to the creation of four strata titles ranging from 386m² to 400m² in area. Three of these lots (lots 1, 2 & 3) will have direct frontage to Northwood Street. The balance of title (125m²) is proposed as common property, which will be used for access to the rear strata title (lot 4).

Provision has been made for a single visitor's car bay to be contained in common property abutting Northwood Street.

The proposed development and subsequent strata titling of the subject land has been considered by Council on several occasions. The key decisions are summarised below:

Subdivision/Amalgamation - 26 August 2008

Council resolved to conditionally support an application for adjustment of the boundary between the two properties resulting in the creation of Lot 883 (the current title)

Strata Title Application – 26 August 2008

Council resolved not to support a strata title application seeking the creation of four strata lots, recommending to the WAPC that consideration of the application be deferred pending Council issuing an approval for four dwellings on the subject land.

Subdivision Approval – 25 November 2008

The WAPC granted conditional approval to the creation of Lot 883 (the subject land)

Group Dwelling Development - 23 December 2008

Council resolved to grant conditional approval to the construction of four group dwellings over a 1.711m² parcel that is now known as Lot 883 (the subject land). The approval was valid for a period of two years, expiring on the 8th of January 2011.

New Strata Title Application - 6 June 2012

The Western Australian Planning Commission sought the Town of Narrogin's comments on a revised survey strata application.

This application was considered by Council at its meeting on the 26th of June 2012, whereby Council resolved not to support the application. The following is a summary of the reasons stated by Council:

- There is no valid approval for the construction of four group dwellings on the land, with group dwellings being an "AP" use. This is a use which is not permitted unless the special approval of Council is granted following advertising.
- The proposed common property did not make suitable provision for the provision of two visitor parking bays as required by TPS No 2.

Survey Strata Title Approval – 12 August 2012

The WAPC granted conditional approval to the survey strata into four strata titles, subject to standard conditions and a condition requiring the design being amended to provide visitor parking bays to the Town's satisfaction.

This approval was granted for a three year period, which expires on the 21st August 2015. The plan approved by WAPC made provision for two parking bays, one either side of the common property driveway.

Prior to the 2012 approval lapsing, the applicants have made a fresh application to the WAPC for a new approval to the proposed survey strata. Council comments are requested to assist the WAPC in determining the application. A copy of the proposed survey strata plan is shown attached as part of the Western Australian Planning Commission correspondence.

Council considered this matter at its Ordinary Meeting held on the 14th of July 2015, whereby it resolved to defer consideration of the proposal.

Comment

To assist Council in determining the application, the following comments are offered.

Current Zoning & Permissibility

The provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 2 include the land within the Single Residential Zone. In accordance with the Zoning and Development Table, Group Dwellings are an "AP" use in the Single Residential Zone. That is a use which is not permitted unless special approval is granted after advertising of the proposal.

Although previously consent was granted to a group dwelling development in January 2009, this approval expired in January 2011.

Density

The Zoning and Development Table for the Single Residential Zone details that where approved, grouped dwellings may be permitted to have a maximum density of R25. As detailed by the Residential Design Codes of Western Australia, a density of R25 equates to an average of 350m² with a minimum lot size of 320m².

The current proposal complies with the maximum density permitted for group dwelling development.

Parking

TPS No 2's Zoning and Development Table identifies that car parking is required at a rate of 2 roofed car bays per dwelling. In addition 1 visitor parking space is required for every 2 dwellings. As stated in clause A4.2 of the Residential Design Codes, visitor parking spaces must be:

- Clearly marked
- Located close to and clearly signposted from the point of entry to the development and outside of any security barrier; and
- Providing a barrier free path of travel for people with disabilities.

The group dwelling design approved by Council in 2009 did not identify any visitor parking on site. Examination of the officer's report to the December 2008 meeting confirms that parking was in accordance with the Residential Design Codes of WA. The application however did not address the Scheme requirement for visitor parking.

Relaxation of Standards

Council may pursuant to clause 6.2.1 of the Scheme relax the requirement for visitor parking, provided that it is satisfied that:

- (i) Approval of the proposal would be consistent with the orderly and proper planning of the locality and the objectives of the scheme;
- (ii) The non-compliance with not have any adverse impact on the occupiers or users of the development, or the inhabitants of the locality; and
- (iii) The spirit and purpose of the requirements/standards are not unreasonably departed from.

Impact of WAPC Strata Approval

As detailed in the Background section, in 2012 Council resolved not to support the application given that the approval to group dwellings had lapsed and the fact the design did not make allowance for visitor parking to be provided. Despite Council's decision not to support the proposal, the WAPC granted approval to a revised strata title plan which reflected the provision of two visitor parking bays.

Given the WAPC's 2012 decision to approve the application despite no approval being in place for group dwelling development, it is likely that the WAPC will grant conditional approval to the current application.

Applications for Subdivision, including survey strata, are made to and determined by the Western Australian Planning Commission in accordance with the Planning and Development Act 2005, associated acts and regulations.

Policy Implications

Pursuant to Planning Policy No 2, the CEO as delegated authority to support applications for subdivision involving less than 5 lots. As Council staff do not support the application for survey strata, Council is requested to determine the application.

- 1. That Council advise the Western Australian Planning Commission, that it objects to the proposed survey strata of No 81 (Lot 889) Northwood Street, Narrogin for the following reasons:
 - a) Currently there is no valid planning approval to construct four grouped dwellings on the land.
 - b) Within the Single Residential Zone, "grouped dwellings" are an "AP" use. That is a use which is not permitted unless approved at the discretion of Council after advertising. Approval to the application as submitted would therefore undermine the Council's ability to refuse an application for group dwellings on the property.
 - c) The proposed common property does not make suitable provision for the establishment of visitor parking at a rate of not less than 1 car bay per 2 units as required in accordance with the Zoning and Development for the Single Residential Zone.

Advice Notes:

- a) The Western Australian Planning Commission is advised that whilst conditional planning consent was previously granted to the establishment of group dwellings on the land, this approval expired in January 2011.
- b) The Commission is further advised that approval to an application proposing the provision of only one visitor parking bay may only be approved through a relaxation of Town Planning Scheme No 2. Pursuant to clause 6.2.1 of the scheme a relaxation may only be granted by an absolute majority of Council.

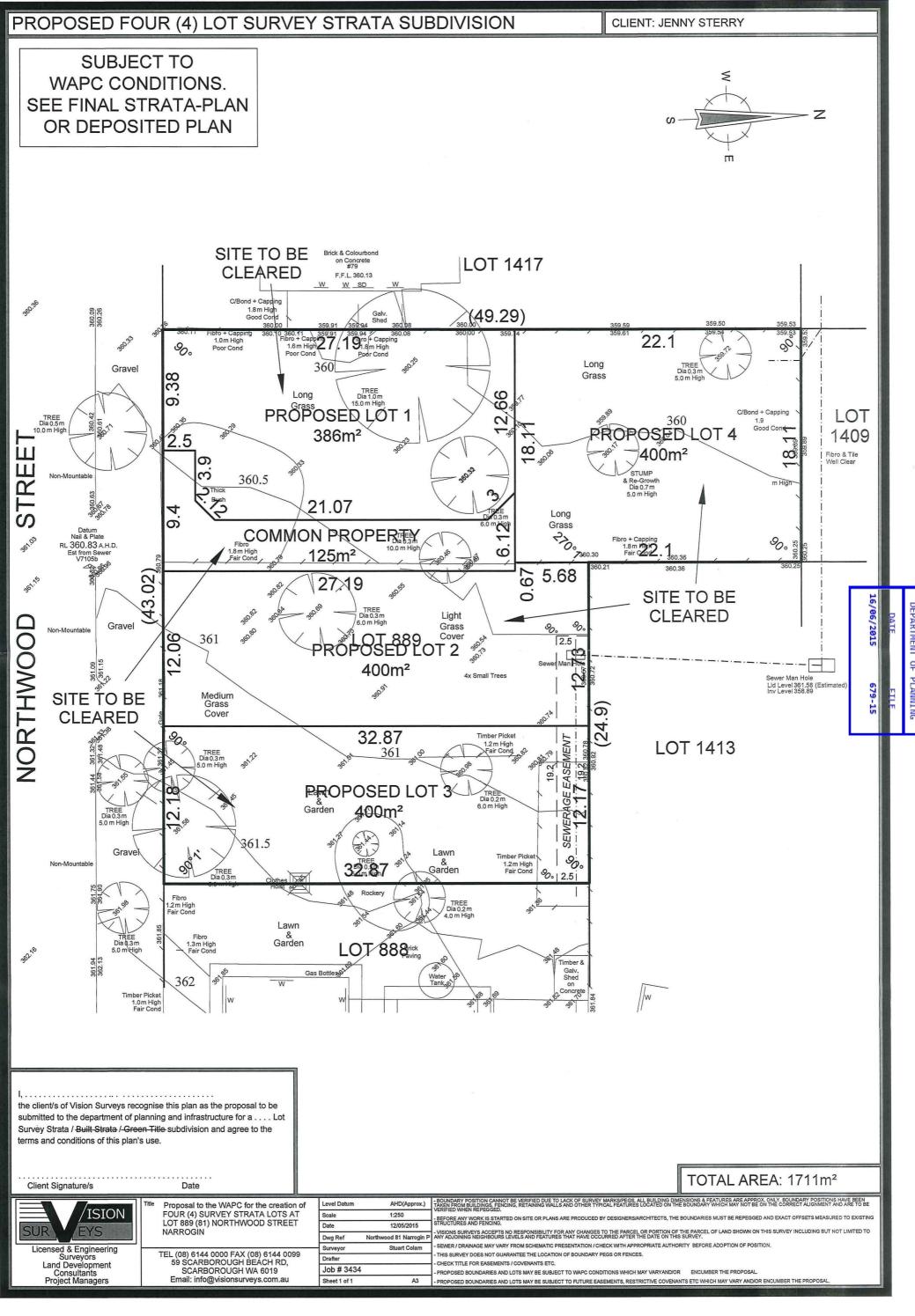

Summary

Council is requested to consider approving the use of the subject land for a Men's Shed and Activity Centre/Office for the aboriginal men of Narrogin, having regard to several submissions received during advertising of the proposal.

Background

The subject land is a 1,196m² property located on the corner of Grant Street and Gordon Street. The site is developed with a dwelling/Office and substantial shed that was previously used for various purposes.

Land abutting and adjacent to the site is used for a variety of purposes including mechanical workshops. An aerial photograph of the property and the adjacent land is shown as attachment No 1.

Approval is being sought to utilise the existing development as "a catalysis for engaging aboriginal men in all KAATA's men's activities and services and provide a location where men could gather, undertake activities and receive support services". Activities to be undertaken within the Men's Shed space include woodworking, repairs to second hand equipment, metal work, welding, motor vehicle repairs and the reconditioning of furniture and equipment.

Council previously considered this application at its Ordinary Meeting held on the 23rd of June 2015, whereby it resolved to:

- Advertise its intent to consider the proposed Men's Shed and Activity Centre on No 2 (Lot 6) Grant Street, being zoned "Other Commercial" and seek public comments for a period of 21 days in accordance with the requirements of Town Planning Scheme No 2; and
- 2. Await a further report on the matter following the close of advertising.

With advertising of the proposal now finalised, Council is requested to determine the application having regard to those submissions received. A summary of the submissions received is provided within the comment section below.

A copy of the submitted applications and supporting correspondence is shown as attachment no 2.

Comment

Town Planning Scheme No 2 provisions include the subject land within the "Other Commercial Zone". A range of uses are permitted within this zone, including, but not limited to Showrooms, Warehouses, Service Premises and Incidental Office.

The application has been advertised for public comment as a 'use not listed', with a total of five submissions being received, of which four object to the proposal. A summary of the submissions is provided below overleaf, whilst full copies of these submissions are available to elected members on request.

To assist Council in determining the application, the following comments are offered:

Land Use

Examination of Town Planning Scheme No 2 indicates that the uses being proposed do not reasonably fit within the land use classifications identified by the Scheme. As stated by clause 2.2.6 of the Scheme, Council may give its consent to a use that is not:-

- (a) Mentioned in the list of use classes in the Development Table; or
- (b) Defined in clause 1.8; or
- (c) Defined in Appendix D to the Town Planning Regulations 1967

Applications for uses not listed in the Town Planning Scheme may be approved by an absolute majority of Council after being advertised for public comment.

Valid Planning Considerations

In accordance with clause 6.4, Council must take into account various matters when determining applications for planning consent. These matters include, but are not limited to:

- (b) the size, shape and character of the land to which the application relates...;
- (c) the existing and likely future character and amenity of the neighbourhood;
- (g) the provision of car parking, access for the manoeuvring of vehicles and likely traffic hazards;
- (i) the submissions received by the Council including representatives made by any public or statutory authority.
- (I) any other matters the Council considers relevant.

Whilst Council is obliged to consider those submissions received, it should be noted that a number of the matters raised are not valid planning considerations. Such matters include:

- i) The availability of alternative sites. Council must determine the current application on its own merits.
- ii) Past and current anti-social behaviour as this cannot be contributed to the proposed land use or its management;
- iii) Anticipated anti-social behaviour as this cannot be substantiated. The potential for anti-social behaviour directly associated with the proposed land use is very much dependant on management of the facility.

As detailed in the summary of submissions, several submissions received have expressed concern regarding past and current antisocial behaviour in the area and the availability of other sites within the Town. In the author's opinion these issues are not valid planning considerations.

Potential Impact on Amenity

In this case, the proposed land use is located in an area that contains a number of automotive businesses. The land use as proposed is therefore unlikely to be detrimentally impacting on the amenity of the area.

Car parking

In accordance with clause 3.4.1 of TPS No 2, carparking must comply with the minimum design requirements and unless otherwise approved by Council must be provided on site and be of paved (or sealed construction).

Being a "use not listed", the provisions of Town Planning Scheme No 2 do not prescribe parking requirements for a "Mens Shed". That said, the scheme identifies the following parking requirements for related/similar uses:

- a) 1 carbay per 40m³ gross floor area for Office uses;
- b) 1.25 carbays per classroom for a Tertiary Education Facility.

In the case of the subject land, an undeveloped area with dimensions of approximately 18m by 12.5m is located in the north east corner of the site. With an appropriate parking design, sufficient room would exist for up to 7 carbays in this area.

Two additional parking bays (more using tandem bays) could also be established in an undeveloped area on the southern side of the building, having an area of some 7m by 30m. However vehicles parked in this area would be unable to enter and leave the site in forward gear.

Landscaping

As specified within the Zoning and Development Table land development within the "Other Commercial" Zone is normally required to have 20% of the site developed and maintained for landscaping.

The specific requirements for landscaping are detailed within clause 3.4.2 of the Scheme, which stipulates that a requirement for the development of garden planting, with one tree for every 10m³ of landscaped area. Areas for pedestrian use may also be counted towards the landscaping of a site.

Additional landscaping is required to ensure the proposal meets with the Scheme requirements.

Accessibility

Given the applicant is proposing to convert the current caretakers residence to an office (public use), the Building Code of Australia specifies that an accessible toilet facility must be provided. Provisions must also be made for disabled into the building and within the building where members of the public will be encouraged to access.

It is recommended that any approval include an advice note to ensure that the applicants are aware of these requirements.

Applications for Planning Consent are determined in accordance with Part 6 of TPS No 2. As outlined in Section 6.5 of the Scheme, Council may grant planning consent, or its special approval with or without conditions or may refuse to grant its consent or approval to an application.

Pursuant to clause 2.2.5 of the Scheme, approval to this application may only be granted by Absolute Majority given that the use is a "use not listed'.

 - i. Be designed, constructed, drained and marked to the satisfaction of the Council prior to the occupation of the development hereby permitted.
 - ii. Thereafter be maintained to the satisfaction of the Town.
 - iii. Be made available for such use at all times and not used for any other purpose.
 - iv. Be properly formed to such levels that it can be used in accordance with the plan.
 - c) Parking areas are not to be used for general storage or any purpose other than the parking of motor vehicles.
 - d) Vehicle crossovers to be designed and constructed to the satisfaction and specifications of Town.
 - e) All stormwater and drainage run off to be contained on site or connected to the Town stormwater legal point of discharge.
 - f) Material storage areas to be screened to the satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin.

- g) The existing landscaping being upgraded and proposals for further landscaping being submitted for approval by the Town of Narrogin prior to commencement of the use hereby approved.
- h) The landscaping upgrades identified in condition No g) above, and as approved by the Town shall be established within 60 days of the practicable completion of the building and from then on maintained to the specification and satisfaction of the Town of Narrogin. Such landscaping is to be fully reticulated.
- i) Uses and activities undertaken within the outbuilding shall be undertaken so as not to disturb nearby or adjacent residents in the locality.

Advice to Applicant:

- a) Any use, additions to and further intensification of any part of the development or land which is not in accordance with the original application or conditions of approval shall be subject to a further development application and consent for that use.
- b) The applicant is encouraged to consider connecting the roof of the proposed and existing development to appropriate size rainwater storage tanks to limit the impact of stormwater. Such water may be used for non-potable purposes including reticulation of landscaped areas.
- c) In respect to condition No 7 above, the applicant is advised that in accordance with Town Planning Scheme No 2 clause 3.2.5, all open storage areas are required to be screened from public view by "a fence, wall, or planting."
- d) The applicant is advised that in accordance with the requirements of the Building Code of Australia, the proposed change of use from a workshop and caretakers dwelling to an office and teaching area (public building) results in a requirement for provision of a disabled parking bay, disabled access to be provided to the building and within the building where members of the public will be permitted and an accessible toilet. It is recommended that the applicant liaise with the Town's Building Surveyor over compliance with these requirements.

Re: Town Planning Scheme (TPS) Development Approval - Lot 6 Grant Street Narrogin - Commercial Other - Use not listed - Seeking approval to use as Men's Shed and Activity Centre/Office.

Kaata-Koorliny in association with the current owner Mr. Warren Reardon, seeks a pre-purchase Town Planning Scheme approval to allow a non-listed TPS use for the existing facility located at 6 Grant Street Narrogin. The use required would be to use the facility as a Men's Shed and Activity Centre/Office for the aboriginal men of Narrogin.

This facility would be the catalysis for engaging aboriginal men in all KAATA's men's activities and services and provide a location where men could gather, undertake activities and receive support services.

The attached plan (from the previous W Reardon planning approval) shows a shaded portion for a proposed residence extension – KAATA would not be proceeding with that extension. The existing residence internally would be converted to an Office facility with 3 offices, a Boardroom/training/meeting room and kitchen facilities. The existing shed would be split into two 10m x15m sections. The rear section would be utilised as a Men's Shed space and the front half of the shed as activity area with tables, lounge and lunchroom kitchenette facilities.

Other items that would relate to the proposal include;

- a) Operation times generally 9am -5am with some Saturday Open Days and occasional after hours activities;
- b) Supervision KAATA staff will open the premises and undertake daytime activities. Volunteers will operate the Men's Shed activities;
- c) Number of persons not anticipated to exceed 20 at any given activity but Men's Shed Open Days and special activity events may see that number exceeded for a limited time;
- d) Men's Shed Activities normal activities including woodworking, repairs to second hand equipment, metal work, welding, motor vehicle repairs, reconditioning of furniture and equipment. Internal safety partitioning and workbenches, equipment spaces, storage of material racks etc. would be set up in the Men's Shed area;

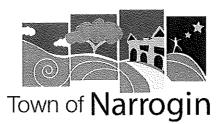
- e) Men's Activities area activities would include Aboriginal Arts and crafts workbenches, a small gym space for Health checks, and Cultural meeting space;
- f) It is not anticipated that additional motor vehicle parking by local men using the facility will be an issue the majority of men the facility caters for, will primarily be walking to the facility. The rear of the office can be used as additional onsite parking; our intention to maintain access to the southern rear sliding doors of the shed and access to the neighbour's motor vehicle repair facility;
- g) The required works to finish the shed and office will be undertaken as soon as trades and materials become available after purchase; KAATA's intention is to have the whole facility operational asap;

KAATA provides copies of the plans submitted with the last development approval for Lot 6 for reference and the TPS Application form; if other updated plans are required to process this approval please advise.

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

financial activity are:

(a) Basis of Accounting

This statement is a special purpose financial report, prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Local Government Act 1995 (as amended) and accompanying regulations (as amended).

(b) The Local Government Reporting Entity

All Funds through which the Council controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this statement.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the statement, but a separate statement of those monies appears at Note 12.

(c) Rounding Off Figures

All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

(d) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions. Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon receipt of the rates.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

In accordance with recommended practice, revenues, expenses and assets capitalised are stated net of any GST recoverable. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of applicable GST.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and cash equivalents as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are included as short-term borrowings in current liabilities.

(g) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables, which generally have 30 - 90 day terms, are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less any allowance for uncollectible amounts.

Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectible.

(h) Inventories

General

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs of necessary to make the sale.

Inventories held from trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months.

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Land Held for Resale

Land purchased for development and/or resale is valued at the lower of the cost and net realisable value. Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development and interest incurred on the financing of that land during its development. Interest and holding charges incurred after development is complete are recognised as expenses.

Revenue arising from the sale of property is recognised in the operating statement as at the time of signing a binding contract of sale.

Land held for resale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(i) Fixed Assets

All assets are initially recognised at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the local government includes the cost of all materials used in the construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

Certain asset classes may be revalued on a regular basis such that the carrying values are not materially different from fair value. Assets carried at fair value are to be revalued with sufficient regularity to ensure the carrying amount does not differ materially from that determined using fair value at reporting date.

(j) Depreciation of Non-Current Assets

All non-current assets having a limited useful life are systematically depreciated over their useful lives in a manner which reflects the consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in those assets.

Depreciation is recognised on a straight-line basis, using rates which are reviewed each reporting period. Major depreciation rates and periods are:

Buildings50 to 100 yearsFurniture and Equipment10 yearsPlant and Equipment5 to 15 years

Sealed roads and streets

(k) Trade and Other Payables

provided to the local government prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Shire becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(l) Employee Benefits

The provisions for employee benefits relates to amounts expected to be paid for long service leave,

- (i) Wages, Salaries, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Short-term Benefits) be settled within 12 months represents the amount the Shire has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees services provided to balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on remuneration rates the Shire expects to pay and includes related on-costs.
- (ii) Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Long-term Benefits)

 The liability for long service leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits and measured as the the reporting date using the project unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and salary levels, experience of employee departures and periods of service. Expected future payments are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows. Where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, the liability is recognised as a current liability.

(m) Interest-bearing Loans and Borrowings

All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the fair value of the consideration received less directly attributable transaction costs.

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities that are yield related are included as part of the carrying amount of the loans and borrowings.

(n) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs are recognised as an expense when incurred except where they are directly attributable capitalised as part of the cost of the particular asset.

Provisions are recognised when: The council has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is more likely than not that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses. is determined by considering the class of obligations as a whole. A provision is recognised even if the likelihood of an outflow with respect to any one of item included in the same class of obligations may be small.

(o) Current and Non-Current Classification

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities where Council does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for resale where it is held as non current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(p) Nature or Type Classifications

Rates

All rates levied under the Local Government Act 1995. Includes general, differential, specific area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears, service charges and sewerage rates.

Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

(p) Nature or Type Classifications (Continued)

Non-Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

Profit on Asset Disposal

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

Fees and Charges

Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, sewerage rates, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

Service Charges

Service charges imposed under Division 6 of Part 6 of the Local Government Act 1995. Regulation 54 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 identifies these are television and radio broadcasting, underground electricity and neighbourhood surveillance services. Exclude rubbish removal charges. Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate installments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as contract services, consultancy, information technology, rental or lease expenditures.

Utilities (Gas, Electricity, Water, etc.)

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

Insurance

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

Loss on asset disposal

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets.

Depreciation on non-current assets

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

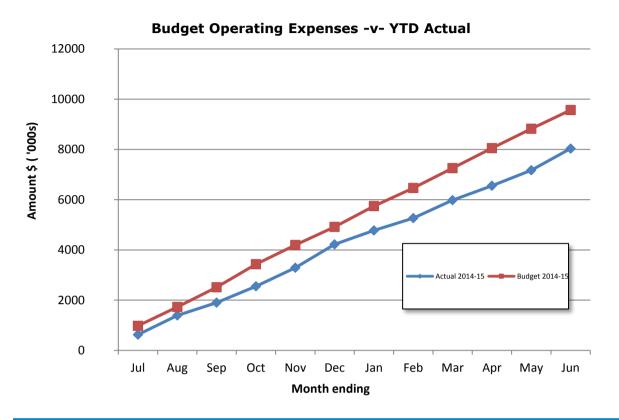

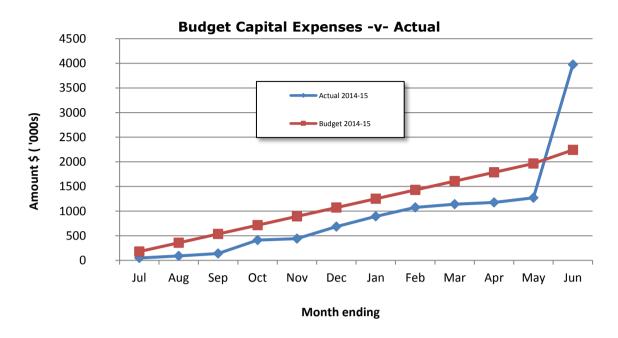

Summary

Council to consider adopting an industry wide resolution with the intention of encouraging the Federal Government to reverse its decision to freeze the annual indexation of its Financial Assistance Grants (FAGs) allocation to local governments.

Background

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) and Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) are conducting a national campaign to highlight the importance of FAGs to Australian Local Governments.

The purpose of the campaign is to try and reverse the Federal Government's decision to freeze the indexation on its local governments FAGs allocations for a three year period. This decision is expected to cost Australian Local Governments around \$925 million by 2017/18.

Comment

FAGs consist of two components, general purpose and local roads grants. Both of these components are considered general purpose funding as they are both untied. There is no requirement to spend the local road grant on roads. Untied grants can be expended on any item that Council considers appropriate. Which makes FAGs very similar in nature and function to rate income.

Any reduction to FAGs funding has an immediate financial impact on a local government and therefore places pressure on Council's to increase rate income or reduce service levels. It is therefore, very important for any local government to protect their FAGs income. It is also true that any increase in FAGs funding will reduce the need for Council to increase its rate income.

It is very difficult, if not impossible for the Town to source ongoing, untied grant funding, as most available grant funding that is offered by either the State or Federal Government's is for a set time and specific purpose.

The ALGA have estimated there will be a permanent reduction of 13% to the FAGs base if the freeze on indexation remains

This campaign is focused on the local government industry as a whole as there is no guarantee that any increase in FAGs funding will be directed to the Town of Narrogin. This is because of the methodology used to determine state and then individual local government's allocations via the different grants commissions.

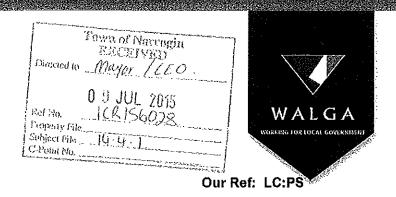

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) is conducting a national campaign to highlight the importance of Financial Assistance Grants (FAGs) to Australian Local Governments. The campaign aims to reverse the damaging three year indexation freeze on FAGs payments that was implemented in the 2014-15 Federal Budget.

FAGs funding is not currently keeping pace with demand for services and infrastructure in local communities and the freeze will worsen this. Freezing FAGs at their current level until 2017-18 will result in a permanent reduction in the FAGs base by 13%.

ALGA, in its 2015 Federal Budget submission, has called for FAGs indexation to be restored immediately and for the Federal Government to consider the adequacy of the quantum of FAGs and the indexation methodology. Whilst the Federal Government recently announced an additional \$1.105B funding addition to the Roads To Recovery (R2R) program, this funding is only allocated for two years and is not guaranteed to continue. Further, R2R is a tied grant program and unlike FAGs funds, cannot be used for general purposes. Any shift away from general purpose funding could seriously impact Local Government's financial sustainability.

In order to guard against this risk, ALGA has previously asked Councils to support the FAGs campaign by passing a resolution similar to the attached draft.

The success of the national campaign relies on more WA Councils passing resolutions to highlight the importance of FAGs. If your Council has not done so already, I ask that you pass such a resolution at the earliest opportunity.

It's also important that Councils acknowledge the receipt of FAGs from the Commonwealth in media releases and Council publications, including annual reports.

Thank you for your commitment to the local government sector and your assistance in our campaign to restore the indexation of Federal Assistance Grants.

ALGA and the state local government associations are seeking the support of Council for advocacy to have the Federal Government reverse the decision to freeze the indexation of FAGs.

While the FAGs are paid through each state's Local Government Grants Commission, the funding originates with the Commonwealth and it is important it is recognised as such. Council, and every other council in Australia, have been asked to pass a resolution acknowledging the importance of the Commonwealth's Financial Assistance Grants in assisting Council to provide important community infrastructure.

Council is also being asked to acknowledge the receipt of Financial Assistance Grants from the Commonwealth in media releases and council publications, including your annual report and to highlight to the media a council project costing a similar size to the FAGs received by Council so that the importance and impact of the grants can be more broadly appreciated.

The Council's Community Chest Fund provides financial assistance of up to \$2,500 on an annual basis to eligible (incorporated not for profit) community organisations for events or projects which benefit the Narrogin community. This amount can be cash and/or in-kind.

At Council's 12 May 2015 Ordinary Meeting, it was resolved that the four community based organisations running annual and major events, namely; Narrogin Rev Heads, Narrogin Spring Festival, Narrogin Agricultural Society and the Dryandra Art, Food & Wine Trail Committee receive an annual allocation of \$7,500 inclusive of \$2,000 in cash and \$5,500 in kind without a need to submit a written application.

Comment

Out of the 11 applications, one was submitted by the Spring Festival Committee and one by the Narrogin Musician's Association. The latter proposed an event which was described as part of the newly reformed Narrogin Agricultural Show. As both the Spring Festival and the Show are to automatically receive an amount of \$2,000 cash each, these applications were not given further consideration.

The reason for The Committee not supporting the following applications:

- Narrogin District Netball Association To purchase a wall display trophy cabinet that will be located in the NRLC for \$2,280.
 - The Committee felt that this type of purchase should be funded by the members of the association via its own fundraising efforts as its likely many other sporting groups apply for this funding if this application was supported.
- **Eagle Sporting Club** Replace and repair ceiling and roof of the Thomas Hogg Oval Clubrooms Office \$2,500.
 - The Committee believed that the Community Chest funding should not be used to fund basic maintenance i of this nature.
- Narrogin Gymnastic Club To purchase and install new equipment \$2,500.
 - The Committee believed that the club has been supported by Community Chest funding in recent years and that other groups should have an opportunity to access this funding.
- Avon Youth To provide transport to youth to its alternative learning program \$2,500.
 - The Committee believed, although this appeared to be a worthy program the provision of a bus service was not considered an appropriate use of Community Chest funding.

The Community Chest Committee expressed a dire to keep some funding available for future applications during the year and that Council should consider having a second advertised application period during the financial year so that other worthy projects/activities can be supported.

At the time of writing the total 2015/16 budget allocation to the Community Chest is \$17,000. A summary of the recommended allocations for 2015/16, the committed allocations to major events and the Community Chest balance based on these allocations is set out below.

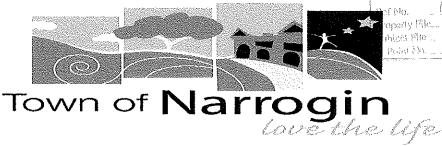

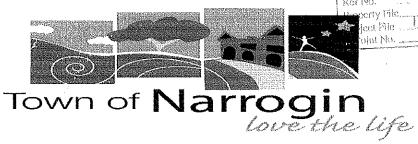
